- I don't see any problem with kids checking their phones between classes or at lunch. I think the teachers need to enforce the rule of not having phones in class, as Mr. Hinze frequently reminds them in his weekly newsletter. After school plans can change at any time, and for spring athletes, this happens almost daily. Mr. Mateski is constantly sending updates through the sports you app. For example, yesterday at 12:30 PM, he sent a message saying the JV team was no longer having practice after school. This meant that Ella needed to ride the bus home, instead of staying after school for practice. Kids need to know these things ahead of time so they can prepare, gather their belongings, and get to the bus in time. If she had to wait until the end of the school day to get that information, she might have to go to both her regular locker and the locker room to get her stuff, and she might miss the bus. Those types of messages aren't emailed to the girls and there is not an announcement. The app is the only way they would know.
- I think my main concern as a parent who deals with this specific issue is this-lots of kids have anxiety and need to know what is happening/coming up so they can mentally prepare for what they need to do. I know for my own kid, her anxiety would be much worse if she had last minute changes to figure out all the time. Which again, as spring athletes, things change every day lately.
