4. GCCISD 2024-25 Budget Reduction Plan Board Workshop #2

Chief Financial Officer Brigitte Clark, Assistant Superintendent of Human Services Matt Bolinger, Director of Personnel Secondary/Auxiliary Lisa Steele, and Director of Finance LeAna Dixon presented a recap of the 3/20/24 budget workshop, presented budget reduction plan for Board consideration as an action item and discussed next steps.

The following topics were discussed:

Budget Deficit Contributing Factors

- Record surplus of \$32 billion, but the Texas legislature chose not to increase funding for public education
- Basic allotment would need to increase by \$1,000 to keep up with inflation since 2019
- ESSER funds utilized for staffing to address learning loss exhausted
 - o District employed the glide method building reserves and adopting deficit
- Property insurance cost increased by nearly \$1 million in one year
- Underfunded/Unfunded mandates such as Safety & Security, Dyslexia, and Accelerated Instruction
- Special Education student counts increased by 1200
- Teacher and other staffing shortages driving up wages
- New facilities increasing operating costs

Budget Reduction Process

- The Budget Reduction Team (Business/HR) met with a District Committee to receive input and strategies.
- TASB Staffing Reports, recently added positions (within the last 4 years), and committee feedback provided guidance.
- Focus on long term sustainability
- Reductions are dramatic due to the deficit.

Three Tier Approach

- Tier 1: Recommended staffing and program related reductions for 2024-2025
- **Tier 2:** Further reductions to meet the budget requirements; these proposals are more dramatic and significant
- **Tier 3:** One time revenue from Chapter 313 and Foreign Trade Zone diverted to General Fund

March 20th Board Workshop Takeaways:

- Remove walk zones from consideration
- Remove Tier 2 items from consideration
- Further reduce contracted services expenses
- Continue to search for additional reductions in costs

Reduction Plan Summary & Considerations

- Reduction plan incorporates a 3% general pay increase (approximately \$6.5 million)
- One-time revenue of \$11.8 million from Chapter 313's and Foreign Trade Zone would have to be made up in next year's budget preparation
- The next Legislative session launching in January could yield additional funding to offset the one-time revenue, but highly uncertain
