Student-to-Counselor Ratios

Although ASCA recommends a 250-to-1 ratio of students to counselors, the national average is actually 479 (2004-2005 school year). This is a an improvement from the previous academic year, when the average was 488. See how the <u>individual states</u> stacks up and see how the individual states' ratios have <u>changed over the past year</u>.

At the high school level, the national average for the 2004-2005 school year is 229 students per counselor. See how the <u>individual states</u> rank.

At the K-8 level, the national average is 882-to-1. There is a greater variation among the states since not every state mandates counselors in the elementary schools. In this chart of the K-8 student-to-counselor ratios, states that mandate counselors are in red.
