Hidden Valley High School athletics are off to a great start. All sports shot through a competitive pre-season schedule and are now getting into the heart of their league schedules. Our coaches have done an outstanding job of preparing our studentathletes for the rigors of league play.

The Skyline league consists of North Valley, Phoenix, Mazama, Klamath Union, Henley and Hidden Valley. The Skyline League is one of the most competitive leagues in the 4A ranks in all athletics. It takes an extreme amount of dedication and work to be successful within this league. Along with preparing

our athletes for competition, our coaches are developing positive *character* within our athletes. Making character a habit within our programs will add to the win column in the long run, it's our goal within the athletic department that all student-athletes involved in our programs have an experience that will last a life time!!

ENRICHMENT

As we make the move to Proficiency grading, we are excited to have built into our schedule SUCCESS periods to help students academically. On Wednesdays, the HVHS schedule includes both a morning and an afternoon 57 minute block. During these times teachers work with small numbers of students who need additional assistance preparing for or retaking assessments, completing homework or making-up missed assignments. Students who are already being successful in their classes use the time to engage in two out of seventeen Enrichment activities such as archery, cooking, guitar, self-defense, survival skills training and others.

Enrichment activities are taught and supervised by teachers, support staff and community volunteers. Each trimester students will chose from a new list of enrichment opportunities. Volunteers from the community who have skills they would like to share with students are welcome to contact the office for more information. A time commitment of offering the class in either the morning or afternoon block or both for nine weeks is all that is needed.

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The Hidden Valley FFA Chapter is up and running for the 2012-13 school year. Approximately 30 members, plus HV Agriculture students came to plow one of the fields to prepare it for planting. Tractor owners taught students how to drive their antique tractors, and pull their plows, then feasted on BBQ burgers and corn-on-the-cob, and the rest of the potluck lunch. Thank you to all of the EDGE and TA members for the great interaction between the generations!
