

IF symptoms persist more than one day, parents should consider evaluation by the child's health care provider who can determine if viral testing is advised.

If you have not already completed your 2021-2022 Meal Time application for free and reduced lunches it is important that you do so now. By completing this now will give you a 30 day grace period in the till October 17. Otherwise, you will need to be prepared to pay full price for all breakfast and lunches until your 2022-2023 application is approved in the fall.

For the 2022-2023 school year there will no longer be free meals for all as we have had the last couple years with COVID.

In light of the pandemic and issues some students have faced with meeting their graduation requirements, the Neah-Kah-Nie school board has decided to reduce graduation requirements to 24 credits. This is a reduction of elective credits needed for graduation for the classes of 2023 and 2024. Those students who have completed graduation requirements are encouraged to stay and explore additional classes, take college courses or participate in job shadows and internships. We thank the school board for providing an equitable option for our struggling students and celebrate those students who go above and beyond to prepare for their futures!

Having a diploma is an important step in preparing students for future success. The knowledge, skills and habits a student develops while being in school, help to prepare them for success as an adult. Developing good study habits and working on self-management skills are an important piece of being successful, both at school and at work! Be on time to class...turn in assignments on time...phones off and away during class - these are all expectations teachers have of students that directly relate to the world of work.






Parents take note: Students who are taking classes from teachers at TBCC need to be aware that if they fail the class or withdraw after the drop date, families will be charged for the cost of the class. This can be anywhere from \$160-\$504 depending on the number of credits they are taking. That is a lot of money that could be better spent on some family needs or fun activities! For trimester 2, the drop date for TBCC classes is 1/13/23. We will be reminding students but we wanted parents to be aware as well.
