CHS Board Report May 2023

Academics and Instruction

U.S. History: Students are examining the end of World War I and preparing to participate in a role play to determine whether or not to ratify the Treaty of Versailles.

Economics: Students just wrapped up a unit on money, which included the history of centralized and decentralized banking in the U.S., different types of money, characteristics and uses of money, the money supply, types and functions of financial institutions, and developments in the banking system in the 20th and 21st centuries.

Spanish I: Students are working to incorporate use of the past tense in communication. Most recently, they read about the history of the celebration of Cinco de Mayo, its early connections to people of the United States, and the reasons it is celebrated differently in Mexico and in the United States.

Spanish II: Students have been practicing vocabulary related to childhood fears and monsters while they examine the use of myths and children's stories in Spanish-speaking cultures.

World Literature: Students have been doing a genre study and analyzing literature using the Greek tragedy by Sophocles, *Antigone*. Theatre related content was one of the weak points for grade 10 as a whole on their MAP scores, so we are filling that gap in this unit.

American Literature: Students are learning how to analyze the impact of rhetorical devices on the quality of a speech. They are using a familiar staple, MLK's "I Have a Dream."

Health: Students are finishing up a unit on nutrition, how to eat for good health, how to use information provided to consumers on food labels, and how to prepare and store food to avoid foodborne illnesses.

Yearbook: With a staff of three students, our yearbook was finished in time for the deadline. The three dedicated staff members did a commendable job.

Welding and Metal Art: Classes were asked by The Marathon Committee to make 12 table metal art pieces with a Herron theme. They fabricated them and delivered with an article being

written in the marathon pamphlet. The welding metal art class has also fabricated a trailer with a 10-foot payload to be sold to the community and funds put into future supply's account. The metal art students are currently fabricating end of the year CCSD staff retirement and resignation gifts for departing employees.

Culture and Climate

Schoolwide Goals: The CHS staff is committed to high standards for behavior and academic achievement. Recently, the staff collaborated on two schoolwide goals for next year. Individually, we've gathered resources related to this goal. Collectively, we will share the resources and determine how we will implement our chosen strategies across the building.
