EXECUTIVE SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

The district is currently funded to provide Early Head Start and Head Start services to 144 children and families, birth-to-five in the City of Southfield, Lathrup Village and the surrounding areas. Southfield Public Schools has a 50-year history of providing comprehensive, quality early childhood services. These services will continue to be offered to the 128 children and families for the 2024-2029 program cycle.
