***UFLI Implementation -** Last school year, our district literacy committee worked diligently to explore ways to improve literacy for all students. This work resulted in adopting an evidence based curriculum known as UFLI Foundations for the 2024-2025 school year. UFLI Foundations is an explicit and systematic program that introduces students to the foundational reading skills necessary for proficient reading. It's been amazing to observe UFLI in action this school year. From K to 3, students and staff are engaging with this curriculum and utilizing resources to support implementation. I'm excited to see the growth our students make in their foundational reading skills from explicit, systematic phonics instruction.

***Pre-K Growing Together -** We hosted our first Pre-K Growing Together Night in August. These events happen throughout the school year and provide an engaging, family friendly evening. This event featured dinner and an opportunity for students and families to interact on the playground. It's a simple event with the purpose of helping families to connect!



***PBIS Kickoff Assembly/Gotcha Party -** Each year we host a PBIS Kickoff Assembly. This event features a PBIS skit that demonstrates our "Respect" rules in action.
