The PreK-12 curriculum shall be established and maintained in accordance with state law, the needs of society, the local community, and the individual student.

The Common Core Wisconsin Academic standards, shall serve as the basis for all curriculum and instructional program development in the District.

The Unity School District's Curriculum Development and Evaluation Plan along with the District Assessment Plan shall guide the yearly evaluation and revision process to ensure that the curriculum remains consistent with classroom practices. This will provide an orderly and systematic process for continual improvement of the curriculum.

The Unity School Board shall delegate to the Curriculum Committee Curriculum Director and the professional staff, under the direction of the Superintendent District Administrator or designee, the responsibility of developing and proposing curriculum adjustments, deletions and additions intended to assure that the curriculum corresponds to the District goals.

The Board encourages integration of the curriculum across subject areas, the development of differentiated instructional practices, relating learning tasks to real world practices, utilizing technology as a tool for learning and providing curriculum coordination both horizontally between buildings and vertically between grades.

Approval of the District Administrator is necessary for the purchase and implementation of curriculum materials.
