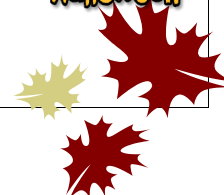

Visitors and New Online Volunteer Application

Parents, as well as community members, are always welcome to visit or volunteer in the classes at Williams Elementary School. Please make prior arrangements with the teacher and office before coming to volunteer. **School Volunteers MUST fill out our New Volunteer Online Application**. A background check will be done and could take up to two weeks to process. The Application is now available online at our school website at www.threerivers.k12.or.us. Just click on the New Volunteer Application under the School News Tab. If you do not have a computer and need help filling out the application, there is a computer available at the school for this purpose.

Parents, visitors, and volunteers must check in with the office and have a **VISITORS PASS** while on the campus during school hours. If you are picking up or dropping off your student always do so through the front office. Please do not enter through the side entrance at anytime during the school day. For the protection of students and the prevention of disruption, **all visitors/volunteers must enter and sign in at the office and pick up a visitor's pass.**



No Child Left Behind

Our school receives federal funds for Title One programs. Under this law, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s). If you request this information, the district will provide you with this information in a timely manner. You have the right to request the following information:

- If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subjects in which the teacher is providing instruction
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived
- The type of college degree major of the teacher and the field of discipline for any graduate degrees and certificates
- If your child is receiving Title One services from paraprofessionals and if so, his/her qualifications

Education of All Disabled Children/Young Adults



Public Law 105.17 known as I.D.E.A. (Individualized Disability Education Act) requires that school districts provide a free and appropriate education to all disabled children/young adults ages 0 to 21.

Three Rivers School District requests the identification of any disabled children/young adults between the ages of 0 to 21, who are not enrolled or currently being served by the district schools.
