Senate Bill 142/Act 122 Bell to Bell, No Cell Act



- No personal cell phones, tablets, smart watches, or bluetooth devices.
- FSPS established policy with exemptions (e.g. IEPs & 504s), that must be approved by DESE (ASBA Policy will be presented prior to the first day of school).
- The District's policy related to SB142 must be posted on the school's website before the first day of school.

Elementary Rules and Rollout

- The phones/smart watches should be turned OFF and put AWAY during the day.

1st Offense	Warning
2nd Offense	Teacher keeps device - will return to student at the end of the day
3rd Offense	Principal keeps device - will return to student at the end of the day
4th Offense	Principal keeps device - will return to parent at the end of the day
5th Offense	Principal may keep until the end of the quarter
