PROPOSED REVISIONS

Emergency Operations Plan	The Superintendent shall ensure updating of the District's emer- gency operations plan and ongoing staff training.
	As required by law, the emergency operations plan shall include the District's procedures addressing:
	 Reasonable security measures when District property is used as a polling place;
	2. Response to an active shooter emergency; and
	 Access to campus buildings and materials necessary for a substitute teacher to carry out the duties of a District em- ployee during an emergency or an emergency drill.
Firearms Purpose	The Board has adopted these provisions regarding firearms to address concerns about effective and timely response to emergency situations on District property, including invasion of a school by an armed outsider; a hostage situation; actions of a student or employee who is armed and poses a direct threat of physical harm to himself, herself, or others; and simi- lar circumstances.
Authorization	Pursuant to its authority under state law, the Board may au- thorize specific District employees to possess certain firearms in schools, at Board meetings, and at school-sponsored or school-related events on District property, to the extent al- lowed by law.
	Each specifically authorized employee shall be approved by action of the Board. The Superintendent shall issue written authorization to each approved employee.
	Participation in this safety program shall be strictly voluntary and shall not be a requirement of any employee position.
Revocation	The Superintendent, as well as the Board, shall have the au- thority to revoke at any time a specific employee's authoriza- tion to possess a firearm under this policy.
	However, authorization for a specific employee to possess a firearm under this policy shall be automatically revoked if the employee is placed on administrative leave or separates from employment with the District, regardless of the reason.
Handgun Licensees	Only a District employee who maintains a current license to carry a handgun in accordance with state law shall be eligible

	for authorization to possess a firearm on District property un- der this policy and in accordance with the District's emer- gency operations plan.
	A District employee who is a handgun license holder but who has not been specifically authorized by Board action under this policy shall not be permitted to possess a firearm on school property except in accordance with the limited provi- sions of DH(LOCAL).
Training	The District shall provide to each District employee who is au- thorized to possess a firearm on District property specialized training in crisis intervention, management of hostage situa- tions, and other topics the Board may determine necessary or appropriate.
Permitted Weapons and Ammunition	Only District-approved firearms and ammunition shall be au- thorized for possession and use under this policy and the Dis- trict's emergency operations procedures.
