### **ACTION**

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Federal Help America Vote Act ("HAVA") requires an accessible voting system to be present in each polling place in which a federal office is on the ballot. This law does not directly impact local political subdivisions elections. However, when adopting this provision into state law, the Texas Legislature added Section 61.012 to the Texas Election Code to provide that by January 1, 2006: Each poling place must provide at least one voting station that:

- Complies with Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. Section 794 and its subsequent amendments and Title II of the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act (C42 U.S.C. Section 12131 et. Seq.) and
- 2. Provides a practical and effective means for voters with physical disabilities to cast secret ballot.

In enacting Section 61.012 of the Code, the Legislature chose not to make a distinction between federal and other elections, and instead impose the same accessibility requirements for all elections. Currently, only an electronic voting system called a Direct Record Electronic ("DRE") is capable of complying with these requirements. As a result we will be required to provide at least one accessible voting system in each polling place in elections held after January 1, 2006. There are no exemptions in the law based on size or type of political subdivision.

According to Bee County Clerk Mirella Davis the County has purchased 19 DRE machines and has agreed to lease the machines to other entities in the county for a flat fee of \$500.00 per machine. This includes use of the machines and all required training for our staff. In order to meet the requirement of this state law we will need to lease four (4) DRE machines from the County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that at all future elections of the Beeville Independent School District, a Direct Recording Electronic Voting machine shall be made available for voters at each polling place for early voting and on election day in addition to regular paper ballots.
