The ongoing charge of the Vicksburg Performing Arts center is to initiate and support opportunities to significantly enrich the educational opportunities of our students and to enhance the quality of life in our community.

Over the 2012-2013 season, Vicksburg Community Schools made significant advances in fulfilling the mission and charge of its Performing Arts Center to serve our students and the community. Here are some highlights:

- Sustained growth in participation in, and audiences, continues to be seen in our extra-curricular musical theatre program. Once again, opportunities to participate in productions were offered to the 4th 8th grades and the 9th 12th grades. In November, audiences' spirits soared with excitement as the PAC presented the classic musical family favorite **My Son Pinocchio, Jr.** Audiences also saw the high school students in **Postmortem** and **The Music Man.**
- The PAC was ready and able to serve the needs of all of the community organizations that present the annual favorites including **Main Street Revue** taking a *Sea Cruise* and the **60**th **Annual Vicksburg Rotary Showboat.**
- In order to keep pace with the demands on our equipment and technology, the following steps were undertaken:
 - A. The first phase in a proposed 5-year plan to replace 102 lighting fixtures with have almost doubled their life expectancy.
 - B. Updating our 10-12 year old wireless microphone system to run on FCC approved bandwidth.
 - C. Offering our clients and audiences the opportunity to make available and purchase tickets online.
