We have so many things at our disposal that we need to use them! We plan to continue to find ways to use the Smartboard, computer programs, and other devices in the classroom to not only enhance learning but to also streamline lessons and activities to help with time management.

Skyward – does many more options than we use now. Teachers will have training this summer to see what else is available and ways they can use it in their classrooms.

Website – one goal is to have a grade level webpage for each grade at elementary as a communication resource for students and parents. Or a Facebook page for each grade level.

Learning A-Z – a new reading program we purchased to progress monitor each student in Reading. A companion software “RAZ Kidz” diagnoses where a student is fluently reading and places them on an individualized program to increase fluency. We will have specific times we will test each student to monitor progress.

Think Through Math – does for math what Learning A-Z and RAZ Kidz does for reading.

Higher Level Thinking questioning and projects – We want our students to be problem solvers and thinkers.

State Comp Funds – will continue to be used to pay salaries for people who help us reach these goals.

We will use the resources we currently have (people, materials, TEKS) to “raise the bar” for our students and prepare them for college, the military, or the work force.

Elementary Campus Plan

In an effort to meet the needs of the 21st Century Learner Harleton Elementary will continue to seek ways to enhance learning through technology, increase the rigor and relevance of learning, and challenge the students to become thinkers and problem solvers. The materials we already have will accomplish most of this goal, we just need to raise the bar and encourage exploration, recovering from mistakes, plus working together and individually to solve problems.

Transfer students will be evaluated closely to ensure that staff and programs that are already stretched are not overcrowded. The programs we have in place will have to meet the higher level standards in order to remain in use and materials will also need to maintain the higher level thinking and processing skills to be used in the classroom.

An “inventory” of programs, materials, and assessments will be continued this year to make sure we are getting our students what they need to compete in today’s world.

With the concentration on curriculum, rigor, and problem solving we feel that a natural by-product will be high scores on the state test...STAAR. The focus needs to turn away from testing and back to student needs, individual success, and digging a little deeper.
