1. What's new at CIHS?

- i. From PBIS: The grade levels with the least number of Behavior Reports (B.R.) for this past month were: 12th grade (9 B.R.)—(2nd month won this semester), 10th grade (6 B.R.)—(2nd month won this semester) and the 8th grade (9 B.R.)—(1st month won this semester). The students in these grades will receive a special treat this month as well as the Ranger Way "You're A Class Act" banner being hung in their locker bay! The "treat or reward" gets bigger the more times a class wins the monthly contest each semester. In Grades 7-12, there were 66 B.R. for the month. This is less than the 99 Behavior Reports last school year for the month of March. Year-to-date totals are: 465 for 2017-18 and 478 for 2016-17. Our goal is to have 80% (or higher) of the students in grades 7-12 with zero or one Behavior Report. At the end of the month, we had 82.3% students with zero or one Behavior Report compared to 82.4% of the students in that category last year.
