## English - Dooley

## English I – Rachel Bradford

This month in English I, we will be reading *The Odyssey*. We will be doing a Comic Book Odyssey project that helps that students to understand the language that they use in the story and put it into pictures. They will them present their section and teach the class about their topic. The plan is to finish *The Odyssey* by the end of the month and take the major test over it. The last thing we will be doing with *The Odyssey* is writing our own epic tale. They use their normal days as their journey and tell me a tale (with added of Greek inspiration) about their trials and tribulations.

#### English II- Rachel Judd

We started off the year getting to know one another and our procedures. The students created excellent social contracts that show their outstanding moral values. Additionally, the students have begun using their binders to keep organized. The students have been introduced to the English II vocabulary quiz procedures (worksheet on Monday, multimedia presentation on Wednesday, quiz on Friday, independent studying in between) and Daily Oral Language (correcting sentences) as bell work in preparation for grammar quizzes. We are beginning to move through the sequence of English II curriculum with short stories and becoming more familiar with literary terms. Students will read selected short stories and then write an autobiographical essay. We will then move into reading our first novel of the year, The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde, in a few weeks.

### Pre AP English II

The Pre AP students truly impressed me with their summer reading projects. We started the year learning procedures and discussing the novels that they read over the summer. Like English II students, Pre AP students will begin with short stories but move into reading their first in class novel, <u>Tuesdays with Morrie</u>. They will simultaneously be spending time with a personal mentor and compiling their notes into a memoir modeled after TWM. Additionally, the students have been introduced to the English II vocabulary quiz procedures (worksheet on Monday, multimedia presentation on Wednesday, quiz on Friday, independent studying in between) and Daily Oral Language (correcting sentences) as bell work in preparation for grammar quizzes

## English IV –Lisa Deaver

English IV students are currently reading <u>The Alchemist</u>. In this novel, a boy discovers his dream and has to fight through obstacles, mostly his own decisions, to determine to follow that dream. The reflective essays that the students have produced have been insightful. Teaching this group of students has already been both fun and rewarding.

## <u>Science – Mrs. Wimbrough</u>

Physics: TL Rouk

Physics: Will be doing a series of labs to analyze the language of kinematics

Pap: Will do this and use motion detectors to create graphs representing actual student motion

### Biology: Ana Harris

Biology- We will be starting the Ecology unit. Students will study ecological relationships and experiment with factors that affect the carrying capacity of an ecosystem. We will then move on to the Biochemistry unit.

#### Pre-AP Biology, AP Biology, Medical Microbiology: Penny Wimbrough

Pre-AP Biology: We are starting our Ecology Unit. During this time the students will look at what components make up an ecosystem and how they affect each other. They will be looking at the impact of competition by using a simulation of a deer population. They will also be designing a unique animal to live in a biome they have chosen.

AP Biology: They are working on one of the 4 big Ideas in AP Biology – Evolution. During this unit they will be doing a virtual lab provided on line By HHMI (Howard Hughes Medical Institute). During this lab they will be looking at material from scientists' research Stickle Back Fish and evaluating the research data.

Medical Microbiology: They have already cultured bacteria from various sites in the room and developed an experiment to test the effectiveness of various hand soaps. Next they will be looking at how bacteria can be controlled and testing various antiseptics and disinfectants to see how effective they are at controlling bacterial growth.

## IPC & Environmental Systems - Michelle Desmond

IPC - right now we are talking about the nature of science, measurements and graphs. We will get into properties of matter, atoms and molecules.

ES- We are discussing overarching themes of Environmental science and what it means. We are going to study ecology next as that is the foundation for environmental science.
