Greetings from the Transition Center

The transition center is where students with disabilities learn to work and take care of themselves. We also recycle to support our program. Last year, we recycled 60,000 pounds of paper and cardboard which allowed us to take field trips, have shopping experiences, and do other community activities. The recycling also pays for our cooking program.

In our recycling program, we take all forms of paper (except paper towels and used tissues), cardboard, magazines, plastic water bottles, pop cans, ink jet cartridges, and cell phones. Our goal is to teach the school population to make better use of their resources as well pro-

vide a training program for this portion of the student body.
