Who:

Nehalem Elementary K-5 students and staff (170 students, 25 staff). (Our preschool will have their own fun separately!)



When:

Monday, October 31 -Students will be leaving the NES parking lot at 1:45 p.m.

Where:

Downtown Nehalem: Classes will parade from school down 8th Street to B street to 7th street and then cross Hwy 101 at the blinking light. Students will walk down one side of Hwy 101, cross Hwy 101 at Nehalem Food Mart and then continue back on Hwy 101 on the other side of the street and then head back to school. Merchants who wish to participate are encouraged to be out on the sidewalk with store-bought candy or other packaged treats for students to walk by and collect. Giving pencils or stickers is always appreciated, too! Nut-free is preferred due to allergies!

***Rainy day back up plan: Students will be parading around the gym! Merchants and parents: If it rains, please come join us here on campus in the gym! (Unless it's REALLY, REALLY raining, the parade is happening OUTSIDE!!! ②) We will make a final decision by 1:20pm!

Why:

To celebrate fall, to connect our school to our community and to have some fun while participating in this Nehalem Elementary School tradition.

What should students wear?

Students usually wear either fall colored clothing (orange & black or yellow, red, orange & brown) or costumes. Costumes MAY NOT be worn to school as students will have time to change before the parade. Costumes must be appropriate for school....please no revealing costumes, no gory costumes or weapons of any kind and please, please make sure the costume can be put on by your child by him or herself, and go over their school clothes- we will not have time to allow students to individually change clothes in the bathrooms.

Staff will not be able to fix hair or face makeup for costumes. Easy is the name of the game!

What about Harvest parties in the school afterward?

Your child's teacher will get information out about this later this month if a party is happening-stay tuned!

What do we need help with?

We'd love to have families along the parade route to cheer us on as we cruise the downtown area! Come meet us there to see the fun! Your child's teacher may contact families to ask for volunteers, especially for our primary grades-again, stay tuned!

What about families who do not want their student(s) to participate?

We are planning an alternative activity at school for students who won't be participating. The activity is yet to be determined, but will probably include games, read aloud books or a short video. <u>Please let your child's teacher know before Monday, Oct. 31th</u> if you prefer your child to remain at school and not be in the parade.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Neah-Kah-Nie School District believes regular school attendance is essential for a student's success in school. Attendance is an area we focus on in order to improve student achievement and ensure all students at Neah-Kah-Nie Schools have the opportunity to maximize their potential.

The district has a new attendance protocol with a dedicated team at each school to:

- Assist families and students in improving student attendance.
- Reduce chronic absenteeism.
- Multi-tiered Attendance Team: Parents, Teachers, Secretary, Principal, Family Resource Coordinator (FRC), Counselor, ESL & Special Education staff.

We encourage families to help your child build the habit of good Attendance

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- . Try to schedule medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how
 to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Seek help from school staff and other parents or community agencies, if you need support.

Dental Sealants October 24th-28th

Free dental sealants are again being offered to students in grades K-5. Permission slips have already gone home and need to be returned by October 20th. If your child has not brought one home, the office has extra copies. ALL forms need to be returned to school – even if you choose not to participate. This program is sponsored by the Oregon Health Authority.

Preschool parents can choose to have a screening done, but no sealants would be done.

Happy October!

In September, we worked on skills for learning, starting with understanding brain states and self regulation. We learned about recognizing our emotions and paying attention to whether they are uncomfortable or comfortable feelings. We also introduced our breathing and listening tools to help us with our self regulation skills to ensure we can get back to our 'green zone' - Where we can do our best learning and be a good friend.

In October we will review Kelso's choices. Students will work on recognizing the size of the problem and work on conflict resolution. We will also be covering student safety with our Child Protection Unit from Second Step. The first two lessons cover ways to stay safe with our "Never Never Rules" and the "Always Ask First Rule."

Mindfulness will continue to be incorporated into our SEL lessons this year. Practicing mindfulness is a great way to train our brains to regain focus and calm... I encourage you to practice this with your


From our Library


