





# What is a registered apprenticeship?

- Registered Apprenticeship provides occupational training that combines paid, on-the-job experience and classroom instruction.
- All programs are registered with BOLI and approved by the Oregon State Apprenticeship & Training Council (which is chaired by the Labor Commissioner)



### **Registered Apprenticeship**



#### Three Components

- Includes structured On-the-Job Training
- Related Classroom Instruction
- Progressive Wage Increase with skill development (average starting wage \$21.20)



#### **BOLI & OCCAC**

According to the Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI) there are over 10,455 registered apprentices in Oregon. Every month, over 200 are added and there are currently 3,981 employers who participate in apprenticeship in Oregon and 160 apprenticeship committees who participate.

The Oregon Community Colleges Apprenticeship Consortium (OCCAC) estimates that 80% of those registered apprentices receive their related instruction through an Oregon Community College.

## Clackamas Community College Apprenticeship


- We currently serve approximately 1300 students per term.
