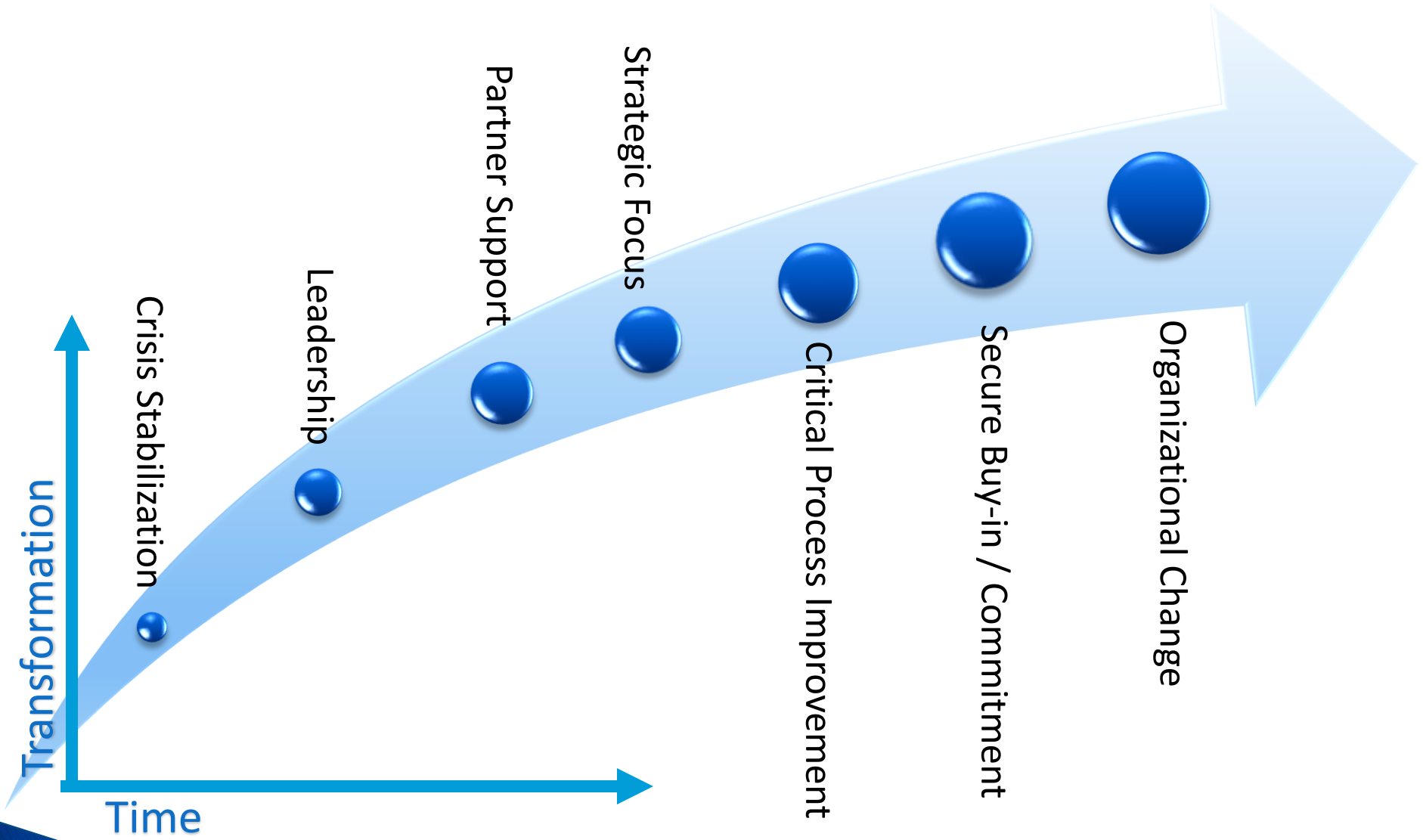
# Vision of WIOA

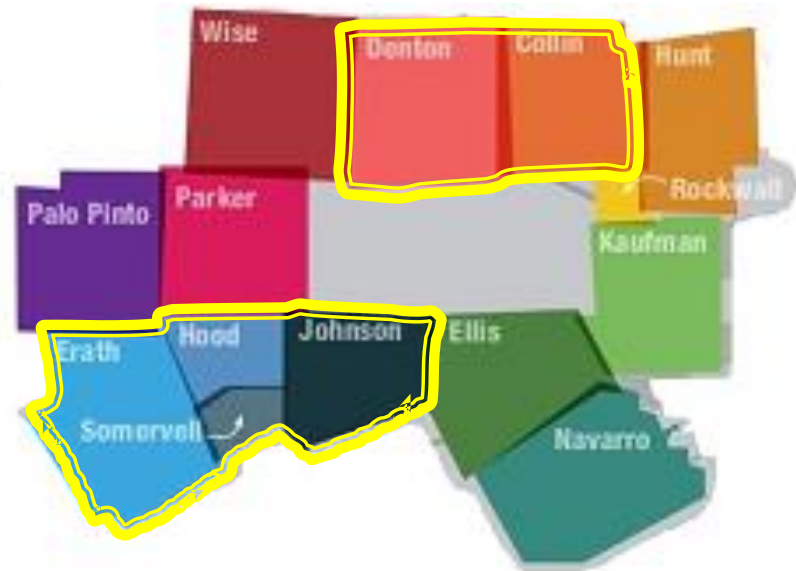
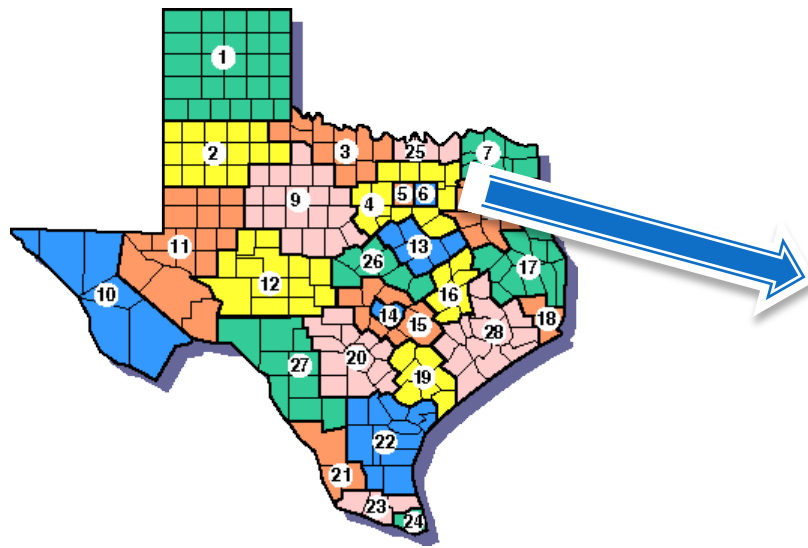
Core purpose of **adult education** is to prepare individuals with the skills and knowledge needed to succeed in **postsecondary education and the workforce.**



# Change Management (Turnaround) Process

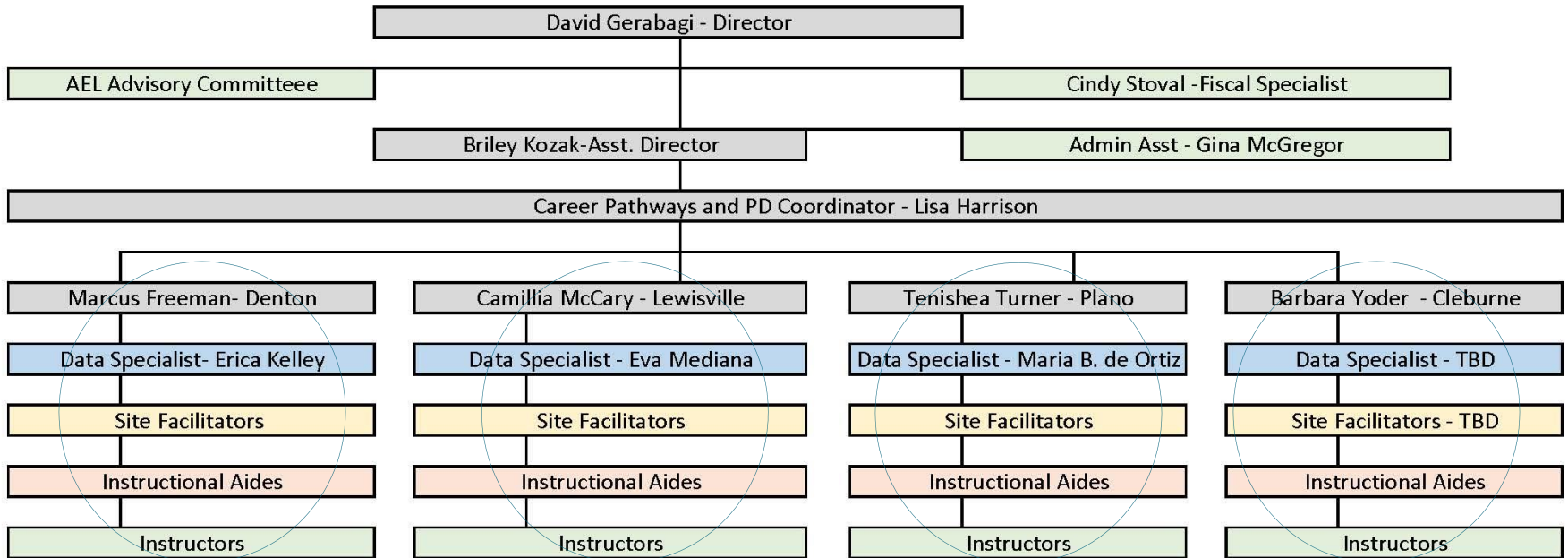


# Denton ISD AEL Service Delivery Areas



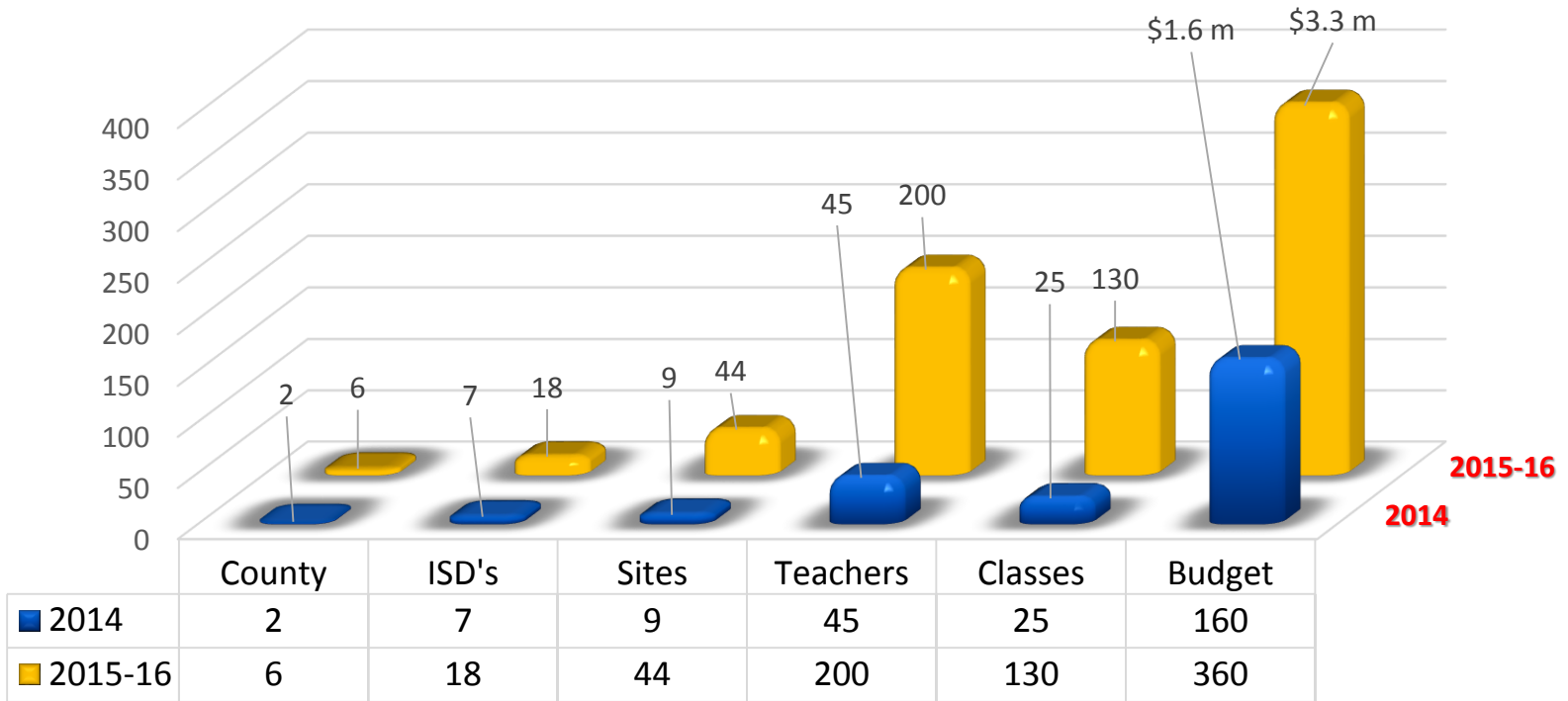


# Organization Chart





## AEL Program Performance 2013-14 vs. 2015-16

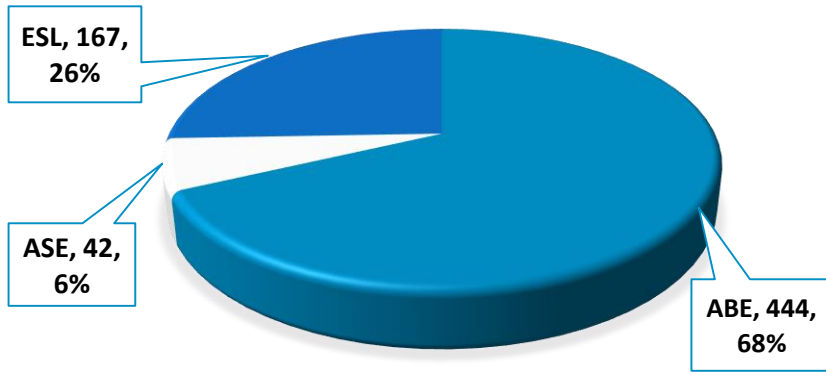


- Procured and set up 4 technology labs across the district
- Recruited and hired 12 additional full time Key central staff
- Provided district email accounts to all AEL Staff
- Relocated AEL Admin. office to Fred Moore
- Built new web site and established social media presence
- Renewed relationships with many partners
- Eliminated the waiting list
- Conduct on going year around registrations
- Started a workplace literacy at Denton Regional Medical Center
- Established a close relationship with NCTC working in two TWC grants, college and careers courses and procurement of welding equipment for ATC
- Incorporated Cleburne AEL operations. 44+ staff in May
- Provide needed and required training to all newly hired instructional staff
- Purchased and distributed adequate instructional materials to teachers
- Set up two satellite admin. offices in McKinney and Lewisville
- Salary increases from \$18 to \$20 and now \$22 (2016-17)
- Presented at TWC (state conference) as an ("AEL Promising Program)
- Plan to automate payroll (by November 2016)



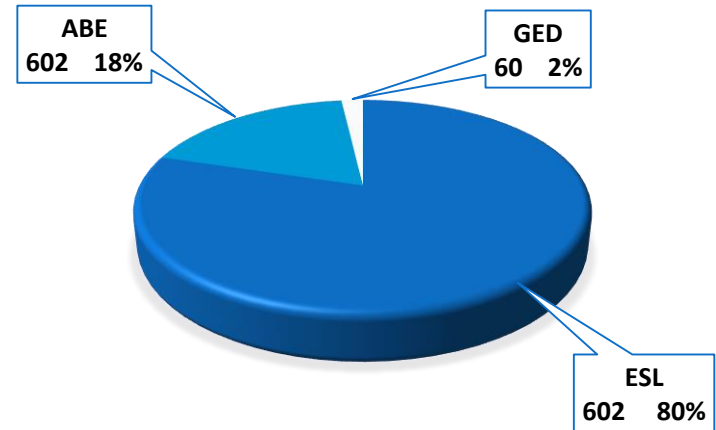


# CISD Enrollment 2015-16

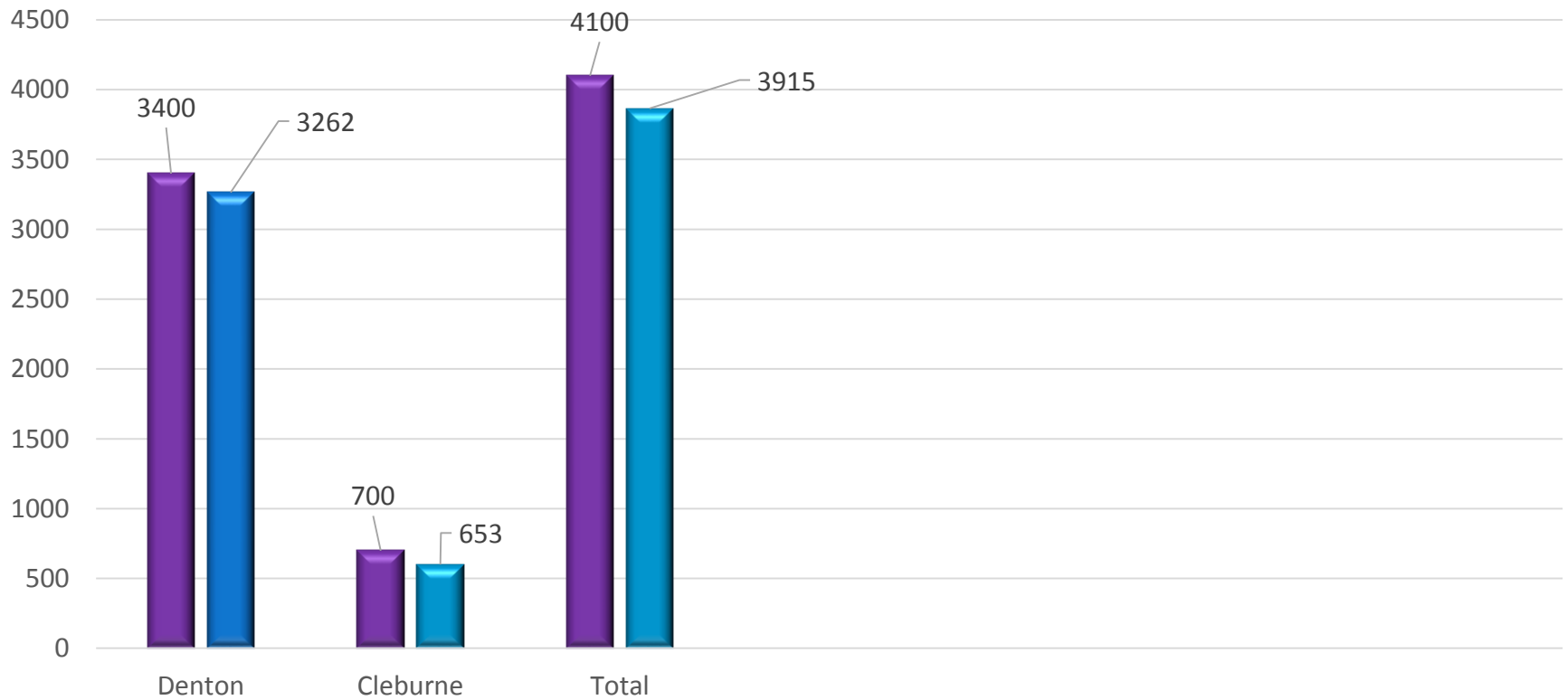
# DISD Enrollment 2015-16

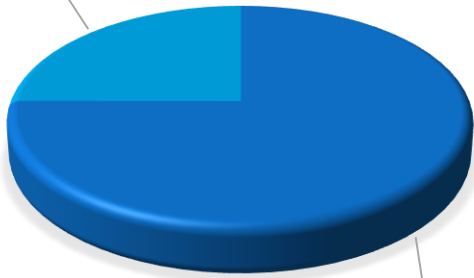

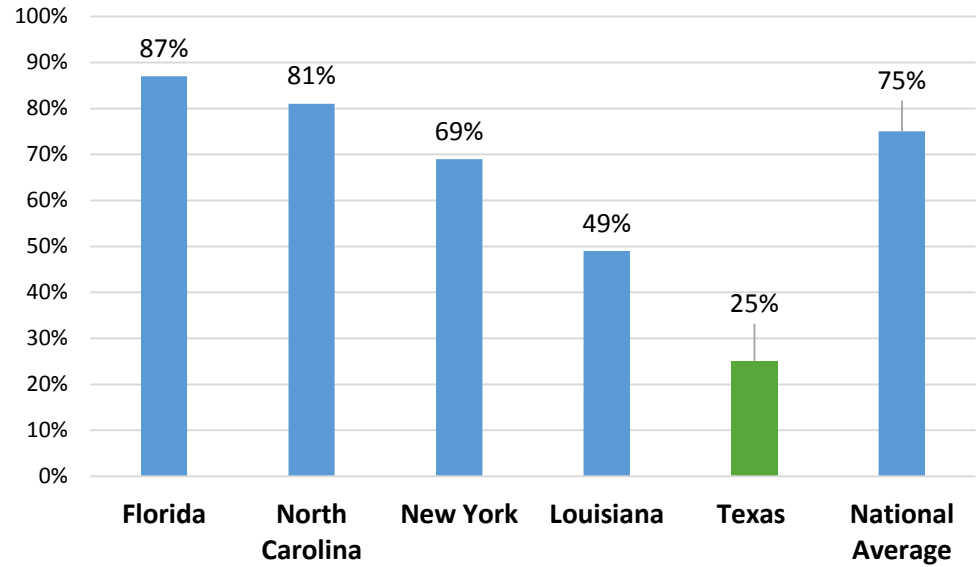

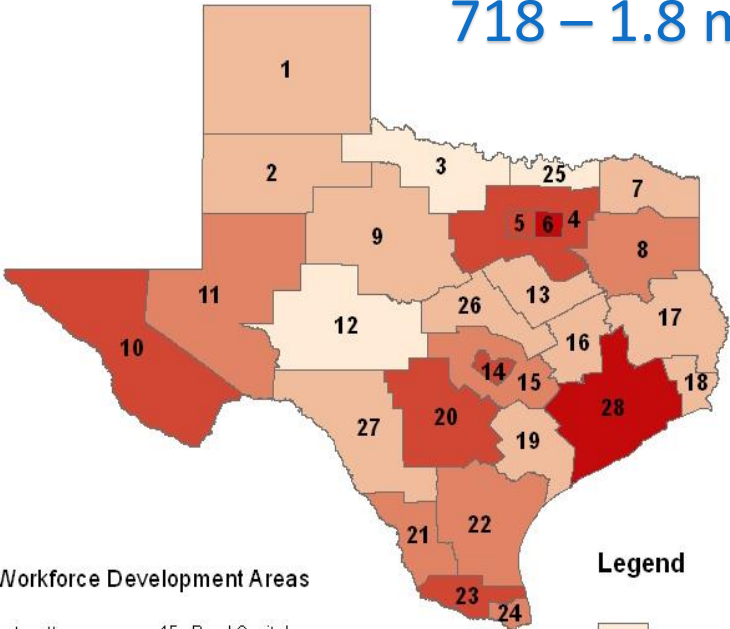

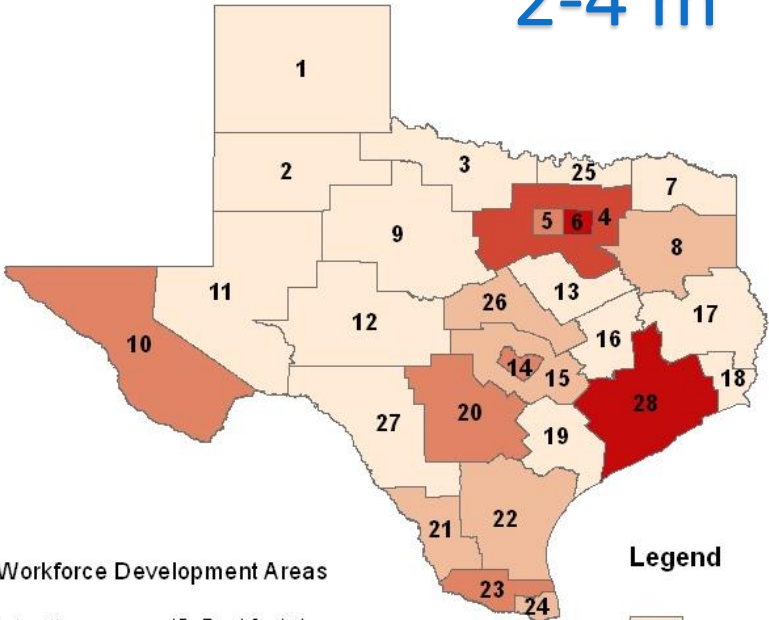

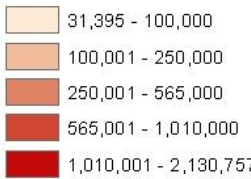
