### Monthly Board Report – December 2025

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#### **December Data Snapshot**

- Child Attendance: Approximately 97–98%, reflecting strong and consistent attendance despite winter weather and holiday schedules.
- Enrollment: Four (4) new children enrolled in December; start date January 5.
- Infant Enrollment: Infant enrollment has resumed, with new infants scheduled to begin in January.
- Current Enrollment Status: Enrollment remains stable with anticipated growth after winter break.
- Staffing: Two (2) open positions; interviews scheduled following Christmas break.
- Program Focus: Continued emphasis on family engagement, consistent attendance, and maintaining safe staff-to-child ratios.

#### **Program Highlights & Family Engagement**

December was a busy and joyful month at the Kukyoossin Learning Center, marked by meaningful family engagement opportunities and seasonal celebrations. We hosted a Family Engagement Night, welcoming families into the center to participate in Christmas-themed crafts and make festive Christmas popcorn together. These activities fostered connection, collaboration, and a strong sense of community.

On December 19th, children visited Santa next door at Bullshoe Elementary School. Staff provided additional reassurance and support for younger children, ensuring each child felt safe and comfortable throughout the experience.

### **Enrollment Update**

Enrollment continued to grow during December, with four additional children enrolled to begin on January 5th. The return of infant enrollment is especially exciting, and staff are preparing classrooms and routines to support smooth transitions.

### **Staffing Update**

The program currently has two open staff positions. Interviews will take place after Christmas break, with the goal of being fully staffed as enrollment increases. Staffing coverage continues to be monitored closely to ensure ratios are met.

### **Outdoor Learning & Wellness**

Favorable weather throughout December allowed children to spend time outdoors whenever possible. Outdoor play supports physical development, emotional regulation, and overall well-being, even during winter months.

As we move into January, we look forward to welcoming new children and families, strengthening staffing, and continuing to provide high-quality, developmentally appropriate early learning experiences
