Goal 1: Engagement

- Hosted a magic show assembly that connected the excitement of magic to the power of reading.

Goal 2: Portrait of a Graduate (P.O.G.)

- New P.O.G signage was installed in our front office.
- Welcomed community guest readers and hosted an Author in Chelsea visit, in partnership with the Chelsea District Library. Guests shared their experiences and connected their stories to the importance of reading.
