trip itinerary - 11 days

Jul 8, 2019: Overnight Flight

Depart from the USA.

Jul 9, 2019: Caen

Bienvenue à Paris. Meet your ACIS Tour Manager who will guide vou on your journey northwest to Caen to begin your first-hand exploration of the impact of two World Wars on Europe. Begin with a visit to the Peace Museum, a compelling precursor to the World War II sites you'll visit tomorrow. (D)

Jul 10. 2019: Caen

Today walk in the footsteps of history as you visit many of Normandy's important World War II sites. See what is remaining of the temporary Mulberry harbor constructed at Arromanches to help offload cargo during the invasion. Entrance to the Arromanches 360 Cinema is included. Next pay tribute at the American Cemetery and Museum at Colleville-sur-Mer before descending from the bluff to walk along Omaha Beach. Then picture the chaos of June 6, 1944 at the bomb-scarred landscape of Pointe du Hoc before reflecting on the cost of war for both sides at the La Cambe German War Cemetery. Tonight's treat is a traditional French crêpe dinner. (B.D)

Jul 11, 2019: Paris

Journey this morning to Paris, and join your local guide for a sightseeing tour of the city. Today's tour shows you the magnificent Arc de Triomphe and Eiffel Tower, Napoleon's final resting place at Les Invalides and the Gothic wonder of Notre Dame – all memorable backdrops from the Victory Parade after the city was liberated by the Allies. (B.D)

Jul 12, 2019: Paris

This morning, travel to Versailles to visit the intricate gardens and stunning palaces of the Sun King, Louis the XIV. Your visit includes the Hall of Mirrors, where the Treaty of Versailles was signed, and the breathtaking surroundings. Return to Paris for a free afternoon. (B.D)

Jul 13, 2019: Ardennes Area

Travel east for a guided visit of the American Monument at Château-Thierry, commemorating the United States forces that fought and died in France during World War I. Continue to the nearby Marine Memorial at Belleau Wood where regiments of the U.S. 4th Marine Brigade endured heavy fighting on the battlefield in June of 1918. Arrive in the Ardennes area in time for dinner. (B,D) Jul 14, 2019: Ardennes Area

Today's excursion highlights the pivotal Battle of the Bulge. First travel to the Belgian town of Bastogne and see the star-shaped Mardasson Memorial honoring the Americans who were killed or wounded. A visit to the Bastogne War Museum provides further context on this pivotal moment in history. Then venture with your local guide into the Ardennes Forest to explore the real foxholes used by the E-company of the 101st Airborne as the Germans advanced. (B.D)

Jul 15, 2019: Nuremberg

Drive to beautiful Nuremberg for a walking tour to view the



Zeppelintribüne at the Nazi Party Rally Grounds, followed by a look at the Palace of Justice, where the infamous Nuremberg war trials were held from 1945 to 1949. (B.D)

Jul 16, 2019: Berlin

This morning visit the Nuremberg Documentation Center, a museum that provides socio-political context for the Nazi reign of terror, with commentary given via audio guide. Continue to Berlin in time for dinner and exploration time in this historical and hip city. (B,D)

Jul 17, 2019: Berlin

Join your local guide for a sightseeing tour of the capital of the Third Reich. See the Soviet War Memorial and Cemetery, Reichstag, Holocaust Memorial, the former locations of the SS and Gestapo headquarters and Hitler's Bunker. In the afternoon, we'll visit the Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp Memorial. a vivid reminder of the war's darkest chapter. Cap off this memorable week with a stroll around Potsdamer Platz. (B.D)

Jul 18, 2019: Departure

Depart for the USA. (B) This is a preliminary itinerary for your group.









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learning objectives

1. Students will gain a deeper understanding of the Second World War by retracing the footsteps of many of its soldiers.

2. Students will consider the impact of the rise of the Third Reich and its policies.

3. Students will learn about the post-WWII agreements made by world leaders and how those decisions impact their lives today.
