for Student Achievement

Goal 1

Improve student achievement

by developing and implementing a challenging curriculum.

District 161 will enhance academic, social, and emotional resources for students through program initiatives, use of data, and staff training.

Curricular consistency

By January 2018, Quarters 1 and 2 topic checklists will be finalized while Quarters 3 and 4 will be written. Quarters 3 and 4 checklists will be finalized by the end of the year.

Curricular articulation

By January 2018, the District will align cits urriculum with LW Fast as needed

Instructional practice

By May 2018, the District will develop guidelines on the quantity of formatives/ summatives, retakes/redos, zeros, and behaviors. Goal 2

Ensure a safe, inspiring, and welcoming environment

for students, staff, parents, and community members.

District 161 will ensure that schools are safe and positive places to learn and work by implementing initiatives expanding school security, easing transitions between schools for families, and improving the learning culture.

Emphasis on social/ emotional protocols

By May 2018, the District will develop, pilot, and implement universal risk assessments, re-entry protocols, procedural checklists, and parent communication to be used when intervening and supporting students in crisis.

Bullying/cyberbullying

During the 2017-18 school year, the District will continue efforts to address bullying and cyberbullying prevention through the use of quarterly cool tools

Goal 3

Strengthen communications & connections

by establishing a communications program that directly helps the District achieve its goals.

District 161 will promote and empower a collaborative culture by engaging stakeholders in the decision making process.

Supt. Advisory Committees

During the 2017-18 school year, topics pertaining to curricular programming and scheduling will be reviewed utilizing a rubric by an advisory committee open to all District staff members who wish to participate. The staff findings will then be discussed with an advisory committee open to all parents and community members. Potential topics:

Leadership Cadre

By January 2018, teachers aspiring to become administrators will participate in Leadership Cadre activities which will include mock interviews, Q&A sessions, and networking.

- Curricular Consistency: Finalize quarterly topic checklists for English/Language Arts (with Technology) and Mathematics
- Curricular Articulation: Continue vertical team meetings with Lincoln-Way East through the Lincoln-Way Area Curriculum Council
- Instructional Practice: Develop consistent assessment and grading guidelines

FALL 2017-2018 STAR ASSESSMENT DATA

 An increased number of students are demonstrating strong individual growth on STAR for the 2017 - 2018 school year.
 Students within the top 3 quartiles are listed below (higher than the 25th Percentile Rank):

Kindergarten: Early Literacy – 76%

First Grade: Math – 86% Reading – 88%

■ Second Grade: Math – 87% Reading – 80%

Third Grade: Math – 94% Reading – 90%

■ Fourth Grade: Math – 94% Reading – 87%

FALL 2017-2018 STAR ASSESSMENT DATA

 Students within the top 3 quartiles are listed below (higher than the 25th Percentile Rank):

Fifth Grade: Math – 91% Reading – 83%

Sixth Grade: Math – 89% Reading – 82%

Seventh Grade: Math – 89% Reading – 84%

■ Eighth Grade: Math — 87% Reading — 82%

- Our focus is on student growth

BOARD GOAL 2 SAFE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

- Social Emotional Protocols: Finalize and implement universal risk assessment and protocols for supporting students in crisis
- Bullying / Cyberbullying: Continue addressing bullying and cyberbullying prevention through the use of PBIS Cool Tools
- Safe Schools Plan: Explore and compare Run/Hide/Fight vs.ALICE emergency practices

Student Behavioral Focus

- Use of Universal Behavior Screener
- Provide PBIS "Kick-off" and Quarterly PBIS "Celebrations" rewarding positive school-wide behaviors.
- Continue monitoring bullying incidents
- Incorporation of Social/Emotional "Push-In Lessons" on key topics (Bullying, Cyberbullying, Emotional Wellness) in addition to PBIS "Cool Tools"
- Continued encouragement to use online bully reporting system to report instances of possible bullying

BOARD GOAL 3 STRENGTHEN COMMUNICATION

- Superintendent Advisory Committees: Staff members, parents, and community members will meet throughout the year to discuss topics related to curricular programming and how it is being delivered.
 - Potential Topics Include: Summit Program, Review of Universal Benchmark Assessment (STAR), Summer Enrichment Program, Utilization of Trimesters, and Teacher Scheduling Models
