The three high school band directors, Josh Dargavell, Maximillian Jones, and Emily Waren, will be attending the Western International Band Clinic in Seattle, Washington from November 21st to 24th. They are looking forward to connecting with fellow band educators, sharing ideas, and gaining new insights from the many professional development sessions offered at the conference. This event also provides an incredible opportunity for our students who auditioned and were selected to perform in one of the WIBC Honor Bands. This year, a total of eight students from the three high schools have earned this honor.

Provide history/background information on your proposal:

The Western International Band Clinic is a convention for both directors and students. Founded in 1979, WIBC features four 150-member high school honor bands under the direction of six world-renowned guest conductors and a featured soloist. Held each November in Seattle, Washington, students from across the United States, Canada, and Australia participate in this prestigious honor band event. In addition to the honor bands, the weekend includes a variety of clinics and sightreading sessions featuring new music for participating directors.

List the advantages of your proposal:

Attending the Western International Band Clinic provides a great opportunity for band instructors to network with professionals from around the world and learn from their experiences. It is also a chance to gain new perspectives and insights on band instruction and bring back fresh ideas to their schools. These experiences help improve teaching methods, enhance the students' learning experience, and ultimately strengthen the school's music program.
