During our last CSAC meeting, we made a special note of how active our teaching staff have been in our community this year. They attend community events, run clubs for our students, and volunteered to support home games at a participation rate that we have not seen in many years. We are incredibly grateful to all of our teachers who are going above and beyond to meet the needs of our students and becoming active members of our Wainwright community.





Strategic Plan Goal & Pedagogy Implementation:

Family & Community Collaboration

Goal 1: Prioritize and implement intentional and purposeful partnerships.

🏀 We had our only home games for Basketball on January 23rd & 24th. The school held the 2nd quarter awards assembly and did a pep rally to kick off the games. We had great participation from students and community in these events. 🏀





It is also important to note the community support beyond the home games. We had many Ulgunigmiut who attended the Ayuktaqta Tournament in Utqiagvik. Many are also planning on attending their games in Atqasuk as well when they travel there.

We will also be working with the Police Department to run a lock down drill in February. Officer Maui walked through the building with Interim Principal Harvey in January to discuss current procedures. When there are two officers in the village during February, they will run a lock down drill, debrief, and run a follow-up drill to implement and feedback from the officers.

Culturally Responsive Instruction

Goal 2: All students perform at or above grade level

The middle of the year testing cycle was completed in January. We still have areas of growth, but also had some areas of success that we wanted to highlight.






Our 2nd grade students have made gains in MClass, with more students scoring proficient at the middle of the year than the beginning of the year.

Our greatest gains on the MClass assessment have been in the MAZE assessment. At the beginning of the year, 61% of our students scored well below. That has decreased to 44% of our students. 29% of students were scoring at or above proficient at the beginning of the year. That number is up to 50%.

When we looked at our MAP scores for math, 1st grade students made great growth towards proficiency. The percentage of students at or above proficiency increased from 11% to 22%. Students scoring well below, decreased from 34% to 22%.



Goal 3: All students are prepared for their pathway of choice post-high school

We are fortunate to have a CTE teacher at Alak School this year. His students have been working on a variety of projects, including Christmas Tree decorations made right before our program picnic benches, and a large playhouse. The Construction students also made whales for the 2nd grade students to paint and use for the Christmas program.












High School Math Highlight

Ms. Daisy, our high school math & art teacher has been doing an excellent job building up math skills with students. Below are two of our high school students who are working on solving equations. Ms. Daisy brings culturally relevant instruction into her math classes. When students were adding polynomials, she used real-life examples to illustrate why it is an important skill for students to know. Her classroom is centered on collaboration, with student discussions and projects being a primary vehicle for building understanding



In her art class, Ms. Daisy has been teaching weaving with her students, using a loom to create designs and patterns.





Goal 4: Graduate bilingual students

Our basketball teams traveled the last week of January through the first week of February. During this time, their instruction was on Google Classroom and Ivalu. After the first week of traveling, Ilisauriit Apiksraq told Mrs. Harvey how proud she was that her students were meeting or exceeding the number of minutes she needed them to be on Ivalu while traveling.

During our awards assembly, Ilisauriit Alaqlu Apikrak-lu gave many awards for the great work our students are doing in their language courses.

On February 21st, we will have a cultural inservice for teachers, which will include a language session with Annauk. It is important that our teachers are using the language when possible in the classroom/school and this training will help in that effort.

Student Social & Emotional Wellbeing


Goal 5: Facilitate & maintain culturally, emotionally, & physically safe learning environments

- Weekly lessons with Ms. M, our guidance counselor happen for elementary students.
- Teachers are using Wayfinder in their TSPs
- We continue our “Students of the Week” and “Caught Being Good” programs
- “No Cell Bell-to-Bell” has been fully implemented in the elementary and middle school levels of the building. We are working towards agreement in the high school so students are not using their phones or airpods during instruction time. We are exploring options on collecting phones in the morning and the possibility of putting that system in place if students cannot keep them stored and use them only at appropriate times.

Our Mission: Students who are empowered, culturally rooted, bilingual healthy, critical, creative, life-long learners.



- Rebekah Chapman offers homework help every Tuesday for any middle/high school student who would like help with their work


