



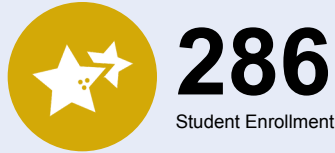

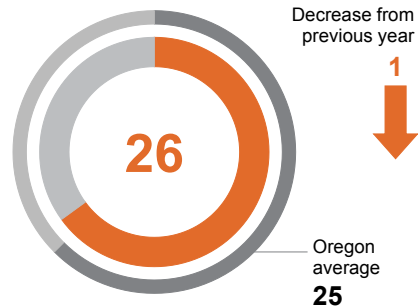

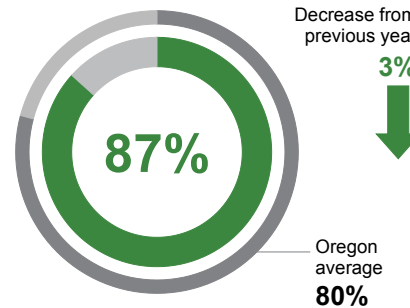
#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS

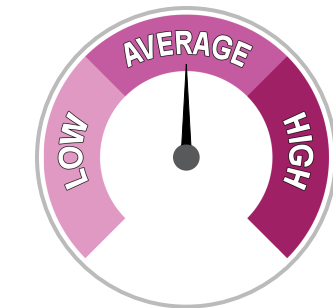
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

#### INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

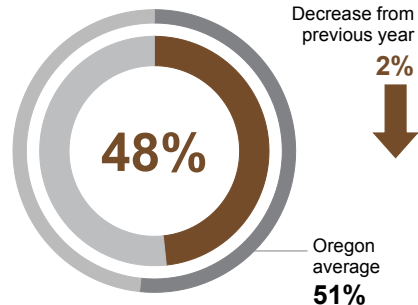
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

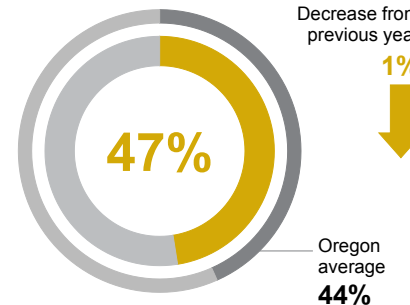
#### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



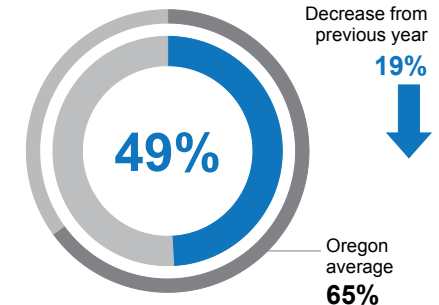
#### MATHEMATICS

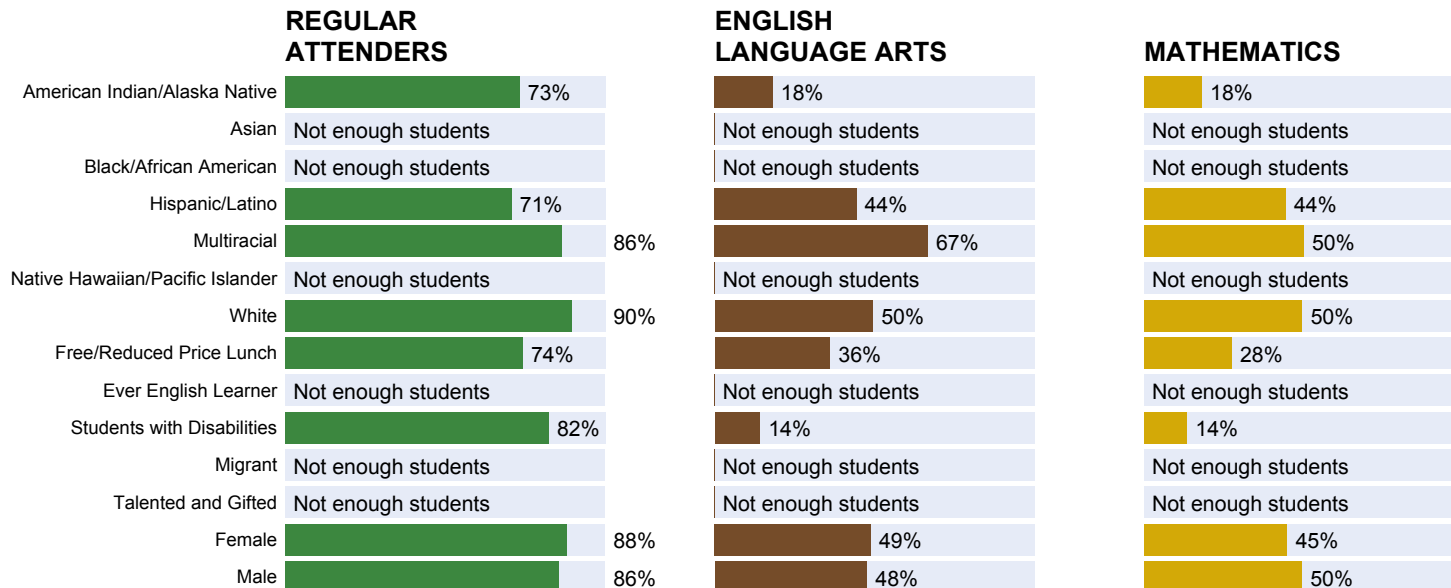

### About Our School

#### BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all of our students, our school child development specialist provides lessons to students and staff about recognizing, addressing, and preventing bullying and harassment behavior. We also have the SafeOregon anonymous reporting line/email available to students and parents which can be found on our school website. We have four award assemblies throughout the year that recognize students for their strengths. Parents are always invited. Our staff continually work with students and parents on a case-by-case basis to address conflict between students and to provide counseling to learn how to respectfully treat others.
