

MEETING DATE: August 18, 2014

AGENDA ITEM: Consider Adoption of an Order Calling A Bond Election

PRESENTER: Dr. Derek Citty, Superintendent; Earl Husfeld, CFO

ALIGNS TO BOARD GOAL(S): All

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: A significant goal found in section 5.1 of the Aledo ISD 2012-15 Strategic Plan reads, "The district will develop a 10 year facilities' needs plan to prepare for future growth, including long range replacement schedules for major cost items."

This specific directive was met during the spring of 2014 with the work and related recommendations to Trustees coming from the Aledo ISD 2025 Committee. This committee submitted a report to Trustees in June outlining a ten-year examination of our facilities needs including the focal areas of safety/security, building/maintenance and technology.

The "immediate needs" identified by the Committee are as follows:

While there are additional needs identified by the Aledo ISD 2025 Committee, the recommendation to Trustees by this committee was to address these as the highest priority. Other projects and needs will be addressed by the District when student growth indicates the need for future

facilities and the District's property value growth facilities our ability to finance future bonds.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION(S): It is important to again note this list is the starting point for future projects identified by the Committee using the available demographic data through the fall of 2024. The Board of Trustees and Administration will be monitoring growth carefully, keep the community aware of all issues related to growth and facility needs, and make recommendations to the community about those future needs as they arise.

A copy of the Order Calling a Bond Election for November 4, 2014 is enclosed for Trustee consideration and forms the legal basis for this item.

FISCAL NOTE: If approved by voters, the various projects found imbedded in the program will increase the indebtedness of AISD by approximately \$61,500,000.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMENDATION: Administration recommends approval of the following Order Calling A Bond Election as presented.

ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTIES OF PARKER AND TARRANT

ALEDO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

:

WHEREAS, this Board of Trustees of the Aledo Independent School District (the "District") deems it advisable to call the election hereinafter ordered (the "Election"); and

WHEREAS, the Election is subject to the provisions of Section 45.003, Texas Education Code, and the District is contracting with Parker County, Texas ("Parker County") and Tarrant County, Texas ("Tarrant County" and, with Parker County, the "Counties") for the administration of the Election pursuant to interlocal agreements with the respective County (the respective "Election Contract") and the Texas Election Code (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, Parker County and Tarrant County, acting through their respective elections administrator (respectively, the "PC Elections Coordinator" and the "TC Elections Coordinator") in accordance with the respective Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that said meeting was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by the Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ALEDO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

- 1. That an election shall be held between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. on November 4, 2014 ("Election Day"), in said District at the respective polling places designated by the Counties in the Election Contracts as set forth in Exhibit "A" below, which exhibit shall be modified to include additional or different Election Day polling places required to conform to the Election Contracts and the Code.
- 2. That the early ballot board and all the election officers designated pursuant to law and the Election Contracts by the Counties are hereby appointed and confirmed to hold said election at said polling places and all early voting places.
- 3. (a) That early voting shall be conducted by personal appearance at the locations and during the period early voting is required or permitted by law, being October 20, 2014 through October 31, 2014, on the dates and at the times set forth in Exhibit "B" below, which exhibit shall be modified to include additional or different early voting polling places, dates and times required to conform to the Election Contracts and the Code.
- (b) Applications for early voting by mail must be received by October 17, 2014 at the following respective addresses:

- (c) Temporary branch early voting shall be conducted at the locations and on the dates and times indicated in <a href="Exhibit"C" below, which exhibit shall be modified to include additional or different temporary branch early voting polling places, dates and times required to conform to the Election Contracts and the Code.
 - 4. That all resident, qualified electors of said District shall be entitled to vote at said election.
 - 5. That at said election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PROPOSITION

Shall the Board of Trustees of Aledo Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$61,500,000 for the purpose of the construction, acquisition and equipment of school buildings in the District, including the purchase of new school buses, and the purchase of the necessary sites for school buildings, with said bonds to mature within not to exceed 40 years from their date, bear interest, and be issued and sold, within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds, and the costs of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?

6. That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITION to be expressed substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION

FOR

THE ISSUANCE OF \$61,500,000 OF BONDS BY ALEDO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS, INCLUDING THE PURCHASE OF NEW SCHOOL BUSES, AND THE PURCHASE OF THE NECESSARY SITES FOR SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND LEVYING THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF, INCLUDING THE COSTS OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS EXECUTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE BONDS

AGAINST

- 7. That proper notice of said election shall be given and, in all respects, said election shall be conducted in accordance with the Code.
- 8. In accordance with the provisions of Section 3.009(b), Code, it is hereby found and determined that:
 - (a) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 6 hereof.
 - (b) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 5 hereof.

- (c) The principal amount of the bonds to be authorized is set forth in Sections 5 and 6 hereof.
- (d) As set forth in Sections 5 and 6 hereof, if the bonds are approved by the voters, the Board of Trustees will be authorized to impose and levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds.
- (e) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 5.00% as calculated in accordance with applicable law. Such estimate is based on advice received from the District's financial advisor, which advice takes into account a number of factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold.
- (f) As set forth in Section 5 hereof, if the bonds are approved, they may be issued in one or more series, to mature over a period not to exceed 40 years.
- (g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the District's bonds (all of which are secured by an unlimited tax levied for debt service purposes) as of the beginning of the District's 2014-15 fiscal year was \$143,481,257.66.
- (h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest on the District's bonds as of the beginning of the District's 2014-15 fiscal year was \$148,276,252.36.
- (i) The ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District for the 2014-15 fiscal year is \$0.2552 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.
