Unity Middle School Awarded PLC Grant!

Unity Middle School was recently awarded a State Personnel Development Grant to develop professional learning communities in the special education program. The grant is made possible by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). The five year grant will help to provide training to special education teachers, administrators, and some parents in developing a professional learning community, designed to increase student achievement amongst our students with disabilities. The first year award is for \$14,000, with each year after ranging from \$10,000 to \$16,000. The award does not require any local matching funds and is focused on increasing student achievement through professional development.

The District Open House is scheduled for Wednesday, August 28th. The school year starts for Unity's students on Tuesday, September 3rd. In preparation for that first day and a successful school year, educators at Unity are busy this summer preparing reading curriculum, technology integration, and intervention training. District Insurance Rates Solidified

In an effort to reduce the impact of various types of insurance on the District budget, the administrative team has been reviewing the insurance programs. With the recent change in student accident insurance, the District will realize several thousand dollars in savings this year. The District was able to secure a lower increase in health and dental insurance by leveraging an additional year agreement. Property and liability insurance premiums have risen this year due to several storm damage claims in the past few years. After the bid process this summer, the District is preparing another bid process for next summer's renewal to address this cost. Lastly, the District's worker compensation plan costs have decreased to the lowest amount in recent years. Efforts to increase workplace safety through training and planning have helped to reduce injuries and the costs associated with them.
