CELL PHONE EXPECTATIONS FRIDLEY MIDDLE SCHOOL

- Away for the Day! New this school year to have cell phones and other technology devices put away in student lockers and/or out of sight. This minimizes the temptation to look at a device during classtime.
- Devices are allowed before 8 am and after 3 pm.
- Students who have a medical or other emergency reason for accessing their phones during the day can discuss an exception with an administrator.
- Minimal issues with phones. Clear expectations for what happens if a students does not meet the expectations.
 - 1 Student can pick up their cell phone at the end of the day. Expectations around cell phone use at school will be reinforced in partnership with the parent/guardian.
 - o 2 and 3- Student's parent/guardian will be required to pick up the cell phone from the office.
 - 4- A plan will be made in partnership between the school and the family to either store the cell phone in the office each day or to leave it at home.
