Also, the State Superintendent has authorized revision of Wisconsin Standards for Environmental Education and Social Studies following the recommendation of the State Superintendent's Standards Review Council and based on public feedback. Drafts of these revised standards, being developed by our state-wide writing committees and informed by key stakeholders from the Wisconsin education and business communities, will be released in late January 2018 for a 30-day public and legislative comment period, which will include two public hearings. 

Forward Exam Item Samplers for all grades and content areas contain samples of stimuli and test items similar to those on the Forward Exam. The items illustrate a sample of the content and types of items that students will encounter on the Forward Exam. In the pdf versions, a summary data table (appendix) for each grade and content area identifies the alignment (standard measured), answer key, depth of knowledge, and annotations for each item. These summary data are also available in the online versions. The online version uses the same format and tools students will see during the actual Forward Exam.



Dropout Early Warning System on WISEdash

- Dropout Early Warning System (DEWS) scores are generated each year for all students in grades 6 through 9.
- The DEWS score is a number from 0-100 that represents the *probability of a student graduating* within 4 years of entering high school.
- The DEWS score is calculated individually for each student and represents how often similar students graduated high school on schedule in prior years.
 - For example, a student with a score of 60 has reported data that looks very similar to students in previous cohorts who graduated on schedule 60% of the time.
 - Three Categories of risk High, Medium, and Low
 - The DEWS Scores are based on **4 factors (Attendance, Discipline, Mobility, and Achievement)**Factors weigh in differently at each grade level
 - Enter WISEdash for Districts
 - o Go to "Student Search" (if you have student detail analyst) to easily select grade level(s) ... OR
 - Select the "Enrollment" dashboard.
 - Scroll down to the "Current Enrollment by Grade Level" chart.
