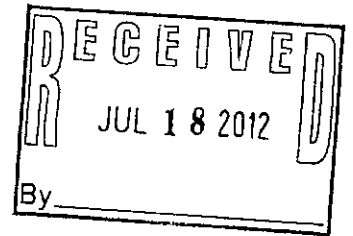

Dear Dr. Wilson:

As you're aware, I have filed to run for another term on the TASB Board of Directors. You may not be aware, however, that Leon Leal from Grapevine-Colleyville ISD has also filed to run for seat 11D, the seat I have occupied for seven years.
