

First-day headcount enrollment for Fall 2024 is **5,437 students**. In addition, students are registered for **54,165 credit hours!**

Friday, October 18: Our Pioneer baseball team hosts UH-Victoria in their first home game of the year! Game time is 1pm at Corbett Park!!




Strategic Plan Key Performance Indicators

With the recent passage of House Bill 8, the majority of funding for Texas Community Colleges will now be based primarily on performance outcomes, specifically metrics such as the number of degrees and certificates awarded, number of dual credit students with 15+ hours, and number of transfer students.

The WCJC Strategic Plan includes multiple key performance indicators (KPIs) that allow for us to holistically evaluate student achievement, including persistence, graduation, and transfer rates. The AY 2024 Annual Report for the Strategic Plan will be published in September 2024 and will include progress reports for each goal, as well as updated data for all KPIs.


Persistence, Graduation, and Transfer Rates.

Emergency Aid






New "Employee Resources" Webpage
