Re: HEARING NOTICE: Recommendation to Classify the Blytheville School District as in Need of Level 5—Intensive Support

Dear Interim Superintendent Blankenship and President Hammett:

The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (the Division) has reviewed the progress and performance of the Blytheville School District (the District) resulting from the instability in leadership that has occurred over the past year. After a thorough analysis, the Division has determined that the District continues to demonstrate deficiencies in the following areas:

- Absence of Coherent Leadership: The vacancy in the superintendent position, delayed staffing decisions, and stalled hiring processes have created organizational instability, weakened strategic planning efforts, and impeded the district's capacity to effectively support students and staff.
- Inconsistent Governance Structure: A lack of cohesive governance practices, including unclear board protocols and blurred boundaries between governance and management roles, has resulted in operational disruptions, diminished trust, and inefficiencies in decision-making across the district.
- Chronic Student Underachievement: The District has experienced a sustained pattern of loss of enrollment and low academic performance, as evidenced by consistently poor outcomes on state assessments, signaling systemic instructional challenges and an urgent need for comprehensive academic improvement strategies.

To promote stability in leadership as a means of ensuring students have the greatest opportunity to benefit from instruction, the Division will recommend that the State Board of Education classify the Blytheville School District as in need of Level 5-Intensive Support under the Arkansas Educational Support and Accountability Act, Ark. Code. Ann. § 6-15-2901 et seq. The Division will make this recommendation to the State Board of Education at a special meeting on May 29, 2025, which will be held at the Blytheville High School auditorium, 600 N. 10<sup>th</sup> Street, Blytheville, Arkansas, at 9:00 a.m.

Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 6-15-2915(c)(1) and the Rules Governing the Arkansas Educational Support and Accountability Act ("Rules"), 6 CAR § 60-120(a)(2), the District may appeal the Division's recommendation to the State Board by filing a written appeal with the Office of the Secretary of Education via certified mail, return receipt requested, within twenty (20) calendar days of the receipt of this written notice. If the District files an appeal, the State Board will conduct a hearing at its May 29, 2025, meeting in accordance with 6 CAR § 60-120(a)(5).
