### School Report Cards To Be Released by DPI

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) will be issuing this year's School Report Card for our school and for every public school in Wisconsin on Tuesday, September 17th. The School Report Card, using multiple measures of student learning, provides valuable guidance on how our school is doing and where it can improve. The report cards help all Wisconsin public schools get a better picture of how well they help children learn, advance to the next grade, and graduate ready for college and career.

The school report card notes performance in four priority areas:

- Student achievement in reading and mathematics on state assessments
- Student growth, measured by year-to-year improvements in achievement
- Closing gaps in performance between specific student groups (comparing English language learners, low-income students, students with disabilities, and members of racial or ethnic groups with their peers)
- On-track to graduation/postsecondary readiness, using reliable predictors of high school graduation and postsecondary success

This will be the second year of DPI using this new accountability measure. School districts will benefit from the ability to analyze the student achievement data to identify areas in which to improve. Additionally, schools who have achieved great progress can be models for others.
