## 2025 Senate and Assembly Bills Affecting Public Schools

- @@AB 1/SB 18: Changes State Assessments (Forward Exams) to previous scoring.
- **AB 2/SB 29:** Require School Boards to adopt policies that prohibit use of wireless communication devices during instructional time.
- @@AB 3/SB 13: Requires instruction of cursive in elementary schools, fluidity by 5th grade.
- **@@AB 4/SB 30:** Requires civics be taught in elementary and high schools with  $\frac{1}{2}$  credit being part of the 3 required social studies credits.
- **AB 5/SB 22:** Requires School Boards to make curricula, textbooks and instructional materials available to parents upon request.
- **\$\$\$AB 6/SB 32:** At least 70% of operating expenses must be directed to instructional expenses (teacher and para salaries & benefits, instructional materials/supplies, athletic programs & co-curricular programs; does not include administrative salaries/benefits nor admin. Support staff {counselors, social workers, psychologists etc})
- **AB 9/SB 11:** Allow federal chartered youth memberships organizations (i.e. Boy/Girl Scouts) to provide information on public school property, during the school day early in the school year.
- **AB 32/SB 10:** Allowing access in public schools for military recruiters (not during class instruction)
- AB 40/SB 41: School safety grants
- **AB 48/SB 67:** Providing state aid to reimburse free meals to all students in schools participating in the federal lunch and breakfast programs.
- **SB 16/AB 51:** Participation in interscholastic athletic associations that provide open records requests and open meetings.
- **AB 55:** Allowing for firearms on school property by school employes
- AB 56/SB 53: Displaying "In God We Trust" in school entries and classrooms
- **AB 60/SB 58:** Required statements/info on referendum questions that affect property tax
- **\$\$\$AB 71/SB 81:** Restricts all referendums to be non-recurring and for a length of no more than 4 years
- **\$\$\$AB 81/SB 61:** Excludes expenditures funded by capital and operating referenda over \$50,000,000 from shared costs for determining equalization aid for school districts.
