 Depending of the severity of the offense, students are subject to additional consequences including, but not limited to, an ISS or DAEP placement.

Failure to follow the procedures of the Disciplinary Consequences may result in additional consequences.

DRESS CODE

- Student dress should be appropriate for a working and learning environment, as well as create and promote respect and responsibility. Students are expected and required to wear clothing that is neat, clean, and safe, fits well, is properly worn, and reflects good taste.
- Any type of attire that is obscene, attracts undue attention to the wearer or causes a disturbance or safety concern for the wearer, or others is not acceptable.
- Students are expected to wear pants that fit appropriately. Pants, shorts, and skirts should cover all underclothing completely. Shorts and skirts should be fitted to cover stomachs, bottoms, and upper thighs. (A good at-home test is to see if when arms hang loosely at the side, with fingers extended, the ends of the fingertips should touch the bottom of the skirt or shorts.)
- Shirts must cover all underclothing, and no halter-tops are permitted. Tank top straps should be at least "three fingers wide." Low cut tops showing cleavage are not permitted.
- Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times.
- Only chains and accessories that are used exclusively as jewelry, and cannot be used in any other way, are allowed (no chains from pants).
- Clothing and accessories (e.g., jewelry) with advertisements for controlled substances (drugs including tobacco and alcohol), decoration that is sexually explicit, vulgar, violent in nature or gang related are incompatible with the school environment and will not be allowed.
- Hats (or other head coverings) are not allowed in the school building. Hats, if worn outdoors, must be worn facing forward.
- Visible tattoos, both permanent and temporary, are not allowed.

Students wearing inappropriate clothing will not be allowed to disrupt the teaching and learning environment. Clothing that we deem inappropriate will not be permitted in the school environment. If students and/or parents question the appropriateness of the clothing, it should not be worn to school. Students will be given the opportunity to correct the problem. If not corrected, the student will be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeated offenses or students refusing to cooperate risk receiving additional consequences and parents will be notified.

<u>Consequences for Dress Code Violations</u> (students must be able to get in dress code regardless of the level of consequence)
