Goal 1: Student Learning and Achievement

Improve student achievement, academic performance and opportunity at all grade levels and for all ability levels and decrease achievement gaps on the path to college and career readiness.

Superintendent-Specific Goals:

100% of students will demonstrate growth toward mastery of Science, ELA and Math as measured by performance at the proficiency level or higher on state summative assessments.

Goal 1: Student Learning and Achievement

Proficiency targets for 2023-2024 summative assessments are:

- 80% of students will meet the proficiency level for literacy as measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessment in grades 3-8 and PSAT/SAT in grades 9-11.
- 70% of students will meet the proficiency level for math as measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessment in grades 3-8 and PSAT/SAT in grades 9-11.
- 80% of students in grades 5, 8 and 11 will meet the proficiency level as measured by the Next Generation Science Standards Assessment.

Focus on Student Learning and Achievement


- Shared message to all faculty throughout the year "All Kids Can"

- Work to grow internal instructional leadership of District Leadership Team
- Emphasis on student-centered data to inform instruction
- Professional learning community (PLC) meetings focused on analyzing student work and goal setting
- Math work on vertical surfaces to make thinking visible
- District focus on meaningful practice and feedback
- Launched EduClimber and DNA to administer assessments and monitor student progress over time
- Advocated for math intervention teacher at GMMS in the fall



Target on Student Individual Growth

- Individualized and small group instruction within the classroom
- Students taught to set goals and track their own progress
- Collaborated across service providers and classroom teachers
- CT-SEDS aligned Planning and Placement Team (PPT) and 504 meetings to establish and monitor targeted student needs
- Instructional coaches worked with teachers to design differentiated student practice opportunities and student support plans
- Planful use of IXL and other online practice tools to reinforce learning and skills
- Utilized Instructional Specialist positions to oversee and coordinate Multi Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)
- Developed common assessments aligned to SAT at the secondary level
- Increased support for student mental health and behavioral needs at all levels.



Superintendent's Message

As you know, this fall we identified two goals from the Granby Public Schools Moving Forward Together Strategic Plan: 2021-2025

to prioritize 1) Student Learning and Achievement. academic performance and opportunity at all grade levels and opportunity at all grade levels achievement gaps on the path to college and career readinests, and 2) Community Engagement Enhance college and career readinests, and 2) Community Engagement Enhance college and committed to empowering students to be resourceful learners, such as the contribution of the Grandy community contributors to the Grandy community.

The Suprintendent's Proposed Budget for Pt/25 supports our goals and upholds our commitment to excellence in the Granby Public Schools. The proposed budget of SS8,118.521 represents an increase of 5.45% above the Pt/25-24 budget and meets the budget guideline set by the Board of Finance. The Board Activation conducted a Budget Activation conducted a Budget of the Suprintendent's Proposed Budget from 5.67% to 6.45%. The budget was adopted by the Board of Education and will be presented to the Board of Finance on Monday, March 25th.

In the fiscal year 2025, we are faced with many real challenges that will put pressure on our ability to reduce the budget:

salaries, transportation, health in-

natural gas & heating oil, nursing services

 Increase in Special Education Costs: 2.77% Includes Increase in: out-of-district tuition and transportation and additional required personnel

In order to uphold our commitment to student achievement, new in FY25. Granby Public Schools will provide targeted support tailored to meet the specific needs of students that are under performing in mathematics under performing in mathematics. Interventionist to serve students at Granby Memorial Middle School. In order to create this new position, we are eliminating a math tutor.



I wish to draw your attention to the small Capital Improvement list for FY2S. This includes our lease payments for technology and transportation and significant needs in the area of safety and security to update our lockdown and salarm panel systems across the district. This is a time-ensitive project that will need to be completed over two years.
