Take Me With You When You Go by Jennifer Niven and David Levithan

Genre: Fiction

The Dark Matter of Mona Starr by Laura Lee Gulledge

She's like a lot of sensitive teenagers—but in the hands of graphic novelist Laura Lee Gulledge, Mona's struggle with depression takes on a vivid, concrete form. Mona calls it her Matter. The Unwanted: Stories of the Syrian Refugees by Don Brown
