We have reached the end of another school year! It went by way too quickly. I have enjoyed spending this school year getting to know your children better and helping them to learn more about our social emotional skills. During this last month of school we will be reviewing our 3 Ways to Stay Safe along with the 8 Never Never Rules, so those are fresh in our mind as we get ready for summer fun.


Throughout this year your child has been working on the 12 Tools of TOOLBOX. The foundation of TOOLBOX is these 12 human capacities within all of us. We have used a simple yet profound metaphor of Tools



inside us to help students access their own inner resilience at any time, and in any situation.

These Tools are simple, but they require practice, practice, and more practice. The more we use this common language around emotional regulation, the better prepared your child will be to handle those big feelings that happen, and solve small problems on their own.

So have fun this summer helping your child build their social emotional skills by helping them to identify where they are on the mood meter and what tool they can use to get back to the green zone. You can even use the mood meter and tools as you read stories during the summer. It's always fun to identify what zone a character is in and what tools they could use to get back to the green zone.



Here are some questions to help guide you as you are reading a story:

Recognize—How is the character feeling? How do you know he/she is feeling that way? Can you
show me a face? <u>Understand</u> What happened that made the character feel?
What happens that makes you feel? <u>Label</u> Where would you put this character on the
mood meter? What is the name of this feeling? Express How did the character act when he/she was
feeling? What else can you do when you are feeling? What tool can you use?
