We work in partnership with families, districts, and other educational providers to increase impact and leverage resources. We provide seamless learning opportunities and transitions for all students from birth to 21.



EARLY INTERVENTION EARLY CHILDHOOD SPECIAL EDUCATION



Component school districts may request evaluation of children, birth to age 5, who have suspected delays for the purpose of determining their eligibility for Early Intervention or Early Childhood Special Education services. The EI/ ECSE Evaluation Team includes early childhood education specialists, speechlanguage pathologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, and school psychologists.

Evaluations include a review of existing information and developmental, speech, language, behavior, and psychological assessments, if needed. Evaluations are classified as File Review (review of existing records only), Partial Evaluation (only one developmental area assessed), or Full Evaluation (two or more developmental areas assessed). Language interpretation services are used with families who are not fluent in English.

Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2015-16

- Transitioned 720 children to kindergarten on September 1, 2016; an increase of 76 over the previous school year:
 - Clatsop County: 57 children
 Columbia County: 57 children
 Tillamook County: 26 children
 Washington County: 586 children
- Completed 2,387 early intervention/early childhood special education evaluations; an increase of 64 over the previous school year.
- Successfully relocated the Beaverton Early Childhood Center to a new location.
- Continued participation in the implementation of the Early Learning Washington County Hub.
- Continued implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) for all early intervention/early childhood special education programs.
- Team attended the Oregon Department of Education Summer Institute and was trained on the Collaborative Problem Solving model.

- Increase child find activities, ensuring that all eligible children and their families have access to services.
- Implement the Collaborative Problem Solving model with the Beaverton team.
- Create new partnerships with community preschools to provide services for children eligible for early childhood special education at the community preschool the children are attending.
- Provide training to the early intervention/early childhood special education staff on executive functioning in young children and implementation of strategies.
- Develop a partnership with the Beaverton School District to provide a joint preschool within an elementary school for children enrolled in early childhood special education and typical peers.

RELATED SERVICES

Related Services supports children from birth to age 21, specifically designed to provide access to specialists with training and experience in working with students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), behavioral and emotional disturbances, orthopedic impairments, vision impairments, hearing impairments, speech language impairments, and those who are medically fragile.

Programs and services include: assessments to determine special education eligibility and education planning, audiology, physical and occupational therapy, speech/language, specialized classrooms for deaf and hard of hearing students, and itinerant services (educational consultation and direct services) for students who are blind/visually impaired, deaf and hard of hearing, or have severe orthopedic impairments, and American Sign Language interpreters.



Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2015-16

- Audiology staff provided a spectrum of services for children birth-21. Families of eligible children were able to purchase hearing aids at cost, and students received ongoing hearing evaluations, monitoring, and equipment programming at no charge to component school districts.
- Itinerant teachers of the deaf/hard of hearing improved skills via self-videos of teaching and reflection with peers.
- Occupational and physical therapists developed shared resources using the Google platform, including videos
 of skills for common reference.
- Autism staff provided professional development and autism evaluation trainings across the region; collaborated with early intervention/early childhood staff for parent coaching; and supported school behavior system implementations.
- Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) trainings were provided across the region, including a two-day conference in the spring of 2017.
- Speech/Language staff successfully implemented Neuro-Semantic programing learning systems in their work with students.

- Ensure the use of the Common Core Standards in planning and instruction within the Groner Deaf/Hard of Hearing program.
- Broaden autism services availability to North Coast families through a partnership with Tillamook Regional Medical Center.
- Expand the use of web-based shared resources to develop and maintain orientation materials for new occupational and physical therapy team members.
- Provide autism training tailored to the specific needs of districts, and host an autism conference spring 2017 for general and special education teachers and specialists.
- Recruit and train partner school district staff as TBI consultants within their schools.

DEPARTMENT OF SCHOOLS



Behavioral Programs: The district provides special education to students in kindergarten through 12th grade with a wide range of specialized classrooms and schools for children with significant developmental, emotional, and behavioral disabilities. Classes operated by NWRESD deliver instruction by licensed teachers and instructional assistants who provide necessary supervision, special education, and related services.

GED Testing Services: The ESD offers GED (General Equivalency Diploma) testing to qualified applicants at the district's Regional Office in Hillsboro and at the Columbia Service Center in St. Helens. In addition, we offer any online testing as distributed through Pearson. This meets many community and educational needs.

Northwest Outdoor Science School: The program gives students opportunities to experience the natural world in an outdoor setting, including Residential Northwest Outdoor Science School Student Participation and Spring Break Northwest Outdoor Science School Student Participation for 5th and 6th graders, Environmental Education Field Studies for 5th - 8th grade classes, and Cascade Education Corps for at-risk high school students.

ORVED: Oregon Virtual Education staff work with districts to provide online courses to students who may not have access otherwise, and/or to supple-

ment their education. ORVED courses provide value for districts by accommodating challenging schedules and by supporting students in need of advanced placement.

Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2015-16

- Implemented Collaborative Problem Solving training for staff throughout the behavior programs.
- Completed agency-wide Safety in Motion (SIM) and Boundary Invasion training.
- Entered into a partnership with the Oregon Blue Zones Project to coordinate and promote staff wellness.

- Ensure that all behavior program teaching staff are highly qualified and teaching content in their area of expertise.
- Create a visible safety plan that incorporates strong communication.
- Strengthen and grow the agency-wide wellness program.
- Work to ensure best practice around implementation of Measure 99: Outdoor School for All.
- Partner with school districts to increase recruitment of high school students as Northwest Outdoor Science School counselors, especially for the spring 2017 session, which competes with Smarter Balance testing and graduation requirements.
- Work with ODE to provide high quality online courses for small, rural school districts.

INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES

The Instructional Services Department provides professional development, curriculum support, and consultation services as requested by component school districts.

Services are designed to assist districts in meeting the requirements of school reform legislation and assessing and training in areas that lead to school improvement in multiple areas including higher attendance and increased graduation rates. In addition the Department supports school districts in increasing their capacity to provide professional development.

The English Language Learner (ELL) and Migrant program supports and collaborates with school districts to develop and implement ELL and Migrant Ed plans that are compliant with state and federal guidelines to ensure equitable access to education for all students.



Equity: NWRESD is committed to supporting staff, districts, and partners in increasing personal and institutional awareness of the role and impact of race on educational outcomes for children of color in schools throughout the region.

Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2015-16

- Assisted school districts in completing their Continuous Improvement Plans (CIPs) and worked with the Oregon Department of Education to develop Essential Skills Reading work samples in Spanish and Mandarin.
- Built capacity in teachers to incorporate language instruction into content-area lessons and created systems to ensure the implementation and long-term sustainability of giving English Learners the analytical language necessary to meet the demands of the Common Core.
- Obtained more timely and accurate data on migrant students to ensure that services are being provided to those most in need.
- Successfully built capacity in the NWRESD leadership team to increase awareness of the role and impact of race on educational outcomes for children of color in schools throughout the region, state, and nation.

- Build a robust Instruction and Curriculum Department and provide high-quality, meaningful services to educators in the region.
- Develop a cadre of regional educators to deliver professional development on regional instructional priorities.
- Provide technical support for the 15 school districts in the ELL Consortium to understand and implement Oregon's House Bill 3499.
- Conduct inventories across the region's high schools to determine priorities and support for implementation of Ballot Measure 98.
- Continue to obtain real time data on migrant children on the move partnering with our technology department to accomplish this long time goal.
- Obtain additional funds to secure a specialist to work hand-in-hand with schools and families from preschool through graduation.
- Continue to meet equity goals set out in the NWRESD Strategic Plan and Equity Plan.

TECHNOLOGY SERVICES



In the pursuit to support the mission of providing equitable access to all students; Columbia George ESD, Multnomah ESD, Northwest Regional ESD, and Willamette ESD joined their technology departments through an intergovernmental agreement in 2011 to form the Cascade Technology Alliance (CTA). CTA now serves 53 constituent school districts, as well as other public and private charter schools and non-profit agencies.

The CTA service model has provided tremendous value for education agencies in the Northwest region of Oregon. Together, the four service districts have provided school districts with enhanced service quality and reliability of technological services while reducing costs. CTA's focus on collaboration has increased its buying power, ability to offer a wide range of services, and provide a team of expert technology staff.

Focusing on providing a broad support network with a borderless service model, CTA has made it possible for smaller districts to participate in services that were previously out of reach. Additionally, CTA has decreased costs for larger districts while continuing to streamline services. Working to provide

expert technical service and support, CTA is also constantly evolving its service offerings as it reviews current needs and trends.

CTA continues to remain focused on achieving real outcomes for students and their families by offering school districts an expansive, responsive set of service options.

Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2015-16

- Aligned CTA technology services with NWRESD Strategic Plan.
- Added Sheridan School District site support (in addition to Jewell, Yamhill-Carlton, Vernonia, Riverdale, and St. Paul School Districts).
- Expanded Medicaid Administrative Claiming service.
- Implemented Restraint & Seclusion tracking application for participating CTA districts.
- Conducted baseline CTA satisfaction and value survey.

- Work with State of Oregon chief information officer and Oregon Department of Education to increase cybersecurity.
- Further automate the way component districts purchase services, and how the associated contracts are generated
- Work with large school districts, ESDs, and Oregon Department of Education on piloting Ed-Fi Alliance Data Standard and Implementation Suite.
- Improve CTA customer satisfaction and value.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

The 2016-17 Local Service Plan calls for administrative and support services for components chool districts, including but not limited to services designed to consolidate component school district business functions, liaison services between the Department of Education and component school districts, and registration of children being taught by private teachers, parents, or legal guardians pursuant to ORS 339.035.

Administrative services provided within Core, at no cost to member districts include courier, home school, emergency closure services, superintendent services, service center administration, and county allocations.

Business services and human resource functions are provided on a contracted basis.



Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2015-16

- Created a 2016-2018 Strategic Plan, Mission Statement, and four Value Statements that bring strong focus to our work, ensuring equitable outcomes for all students.
- Integrated equity work into the agency's new strategic plan, and ensured all NWRESD administrators participated in ongoing equity training.
- Supported school districts in developing high-quality programs in the following areas: Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM); Career and Technical Education (CTE); College Going; and Early Learning.
- Worked successfully with NWRESD member school districts so that all 20 districts within the region are participating as full members of the ESD.
- Ensured all staff participated in performance evaluations per contract and state law by July 1, 2016.

- Work with component districts to incorporate high-quality, high-value Curriculum and Instruction Services in the 2017-18 Local Service Plan.
- Continue to support school districts in developing quality programs that lead to increased graduation rates and college- and career-readiness.
- Support the Northwest Early Learning Hub in its work to increase 2016 kindergarten assessment scores across the region.
- Ensure 95 percent of ESD staff receive equity training.





Early Intervention/Early Childhood Services (EI/ECSE):
