Regular Meeting  
SCHOOL BOARD  
SEPTEMBER 23, 2025

Chair Yang called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM with the following present: Chair Yang, Vice Chair C. Anderson, Clerk Livingston, Director Swor, Nitardy, Yener, Superintendent Tucci Osorio, and Student Board Representatives Orozco and Rodriguez. Absent: Treasurer Martens.

1.
