Future Needs:

DHS -

- Increase the MYP Coordinator position to full-time. Over 1000 9th and 10th grade MYP students at DHS need monitoring.
- Current growth in the Diploma Program will result in higher IB testing fees (about \$700 per student) and increase textbook/supply needs.
- Creativity, Action and Service coordinator with reinstatement of stipend (\$2000) for outside contract work helping students serve in the community.

CMS -

- Continued funding for staff development to reach goal of all teachers trained in Category III levels
- Forward planning for continued growth through IB transfers. 6th and 7th grades closed to transfers due to lack of teachers, not facilities.
- High need of another Language B Spanish teacher to meet needs of native-speaking students and those with experience (ie. Newton Rayzor students who have had Spanish for 5 years) as they transition to Calhoun.

NRE -

- Funding for additional student computer availability, such as mobile computer carts.
- Continued funding for staff development to reach goal of all teachers trained in Category III levels
- Forward planning for continued growth through IB transfers.

Results:

- 3 Diplomas earned (24 points required)
- All full-diploma candidates are at 4 year universities (UT, UNT, Austin College, Univ. of Nebraska-Lincoln)
- Total Scores on IB tests ranged from 17 to 32
- One student earned 26 hours at UNT with an IB total score of 22.
- One student earned 12 hours at UNT for the 5 she scored in English HL.
