#### This is the Action Plan Steps identified in the plan to reach the goal.

1. Intervention aides will be hired to work with small groups of students who are struggling to meet the proficiency goals set for each grade.

2. Americorp Literacy coordinator will be hired to organize, train, supervise volunteers and collect data on students.

2. Dedicated time for collaboration of teachers and intervention team to ensure specific and prescriptive intervention are being appropriately provided for struggling learners.

3. Professional development for teachers and interventionists to improve student interventions.

4. After school homework help will be offered for all students in need of additional time.

5. Purchase Acadience Amplify for fourth and fifth grade so that there will be progress monitoring for all students at the beginning, middle, and end of year.

6. A keyboarding program will be purchased to help students gain proficiency in using technology for learning.

6. A technology specialist will be utilized to assist students in gaining access to technology and software.

7. School supplies will be purchase to help accommodate teachers wth their Tier I instruction and in measuring student progress.
