
Site Council Meeting 09/26/24 Members present: Damian Crowson, Tammy Allen, Ben Bickle, Krystal Graham

- · 4 slices of bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup milk or cream
- Salt and pepper to taste
- · Chopped chives for garnish

Instructions:

- 1. In a pot, sauté the onion until soft.
- 2. Add the potatoes and chicken broth, simmering until the potatoes are tender (about 15 minutes).
- 3. Blend half of the soup to thicken it, then return to the pot.
- 4. Stir in the milk, cheddar cheese, and bacon. Simmer for a few minutes until melted and creamy.
- 5. Season with salt and pepper, and garnish with chives.

This savory, filling soup is perfect for cozy evenings, and it's always a hit with the family. Maybe add some fresh rolls or cornbread. That is never a bad idea.

In addition to all the seasonal fun, **Homecoming** is just around the corner! We're gearing up for an exciting week, with the **Homecoming football game against North Bend** on **October 25th** and the **Homecoming Dance** on **October 26th**.
