Utah Code 53G-10-402

(8) An LEA governing board shall review every two years:

- teen pregnancy;
- child sexual abuse; and
- sexually transmitted diseases and sexually transmitted infections; and
- the number of pornography complaints or other instances reported within the jurisdiction of the LEA governing board.

Teen Pregnancy

Definition

The adolescent birth rate is reported as the number of live births per 1,000 adolescent females aged 15-19.

Rates in Utah?

The teen birth rates per 1,000 females aged 15-19 in Utah, for the past five years were:

2019: 11.4

2020: 10.2

2021: 9.2

2022: 8.3

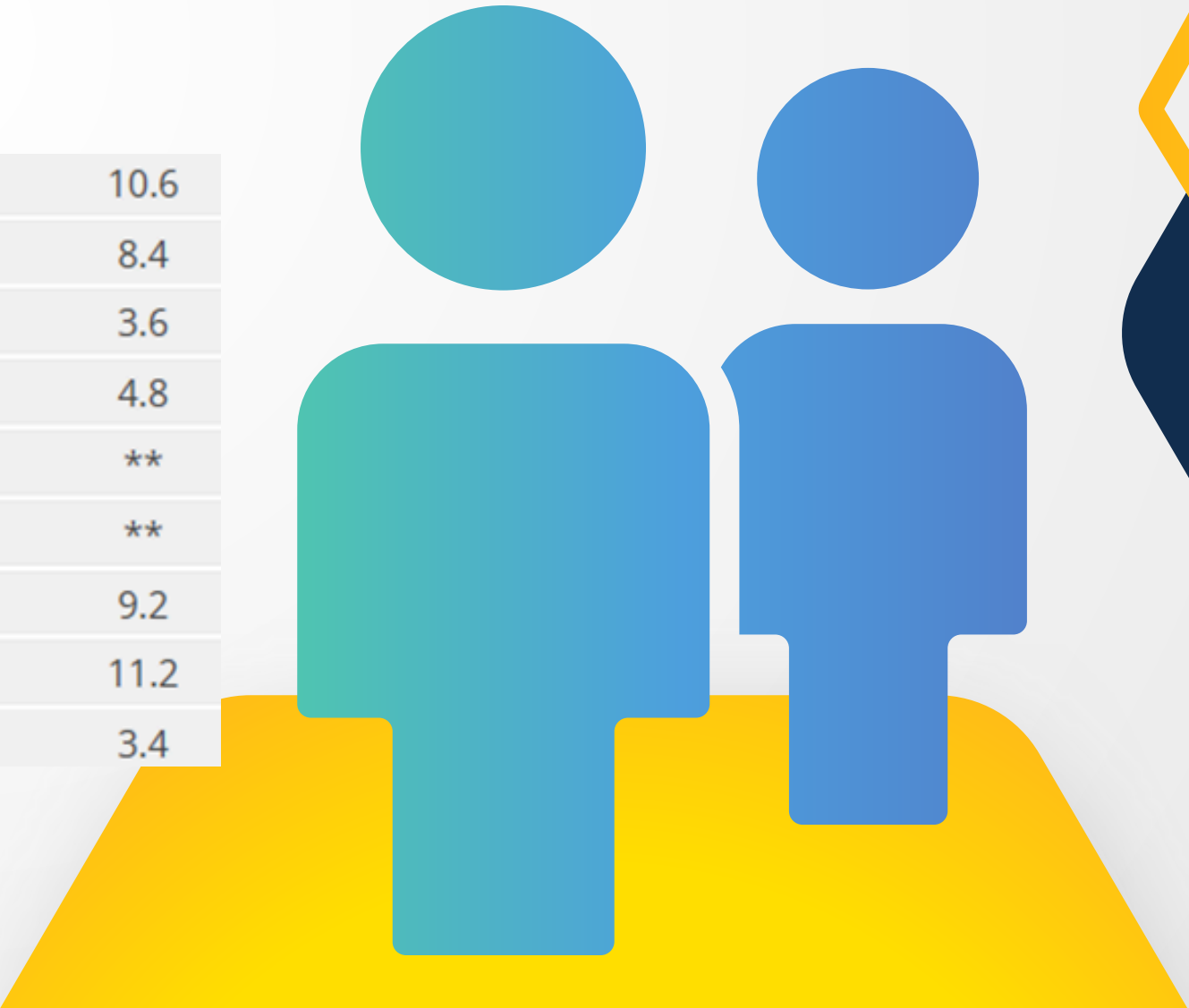
2023: 8.0

According to the 2022 Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring Survey (PRAMS) data, 42% of Utah teen mothers (age 15-19) reported their pregnancies as mistimed or unwanted. Another 25% reported that they were unsure whether or not they wanted to be pregnant.

How do we compare with the U.S.?

The adolescent birth rate in Utah has been lower than the U.S. overall rate over the past decade but is higher than in several other states. Utah and U.S. adolescent birth rates per 1,000 females aged 15-19 for the past five years were:

2019: Utah 11.4 / U.S. 16.7

2020: Utah 10.2 / U.S. 15.4

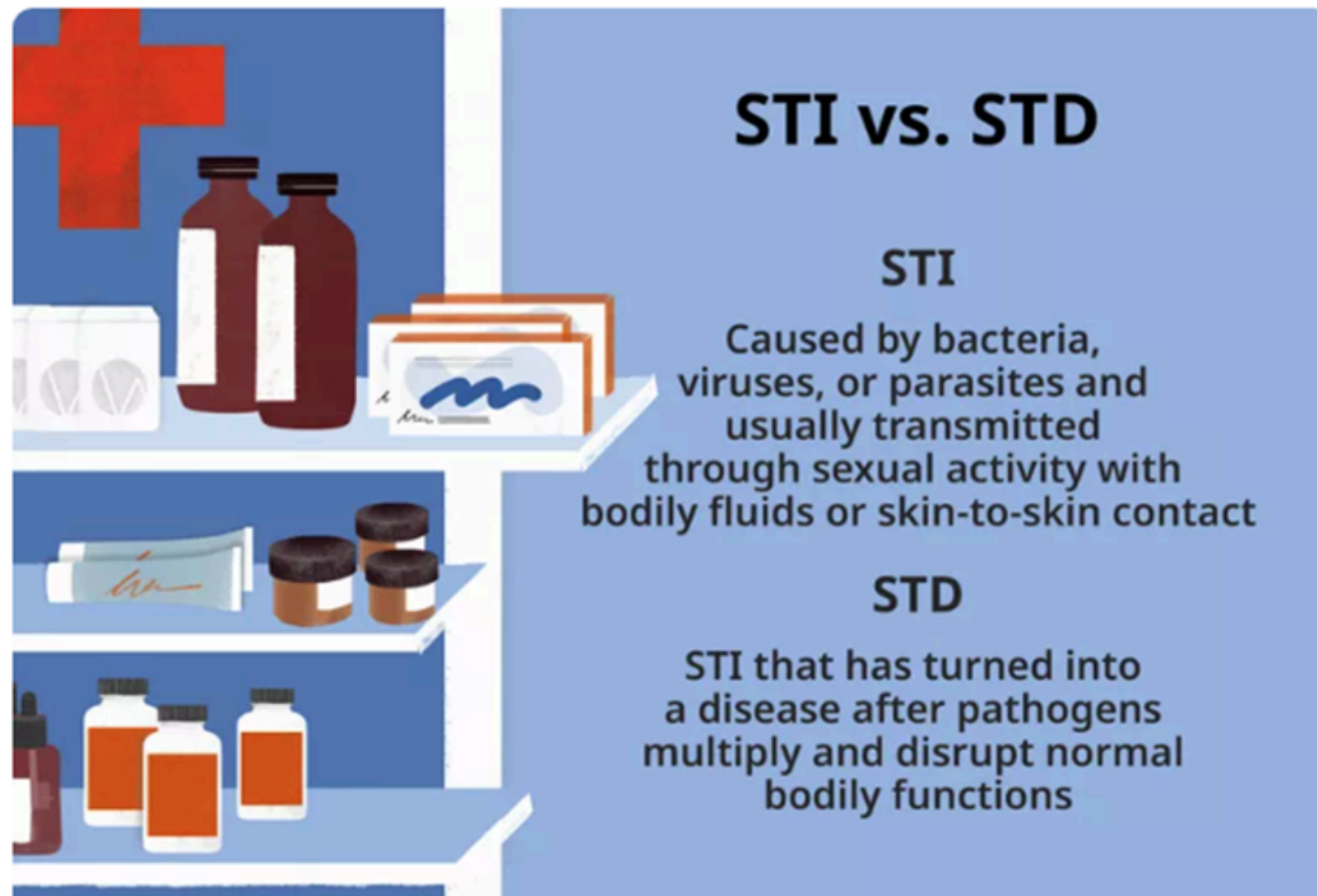
2021: Utah 9.2 / U.S. 13.9

2022: Utah 8.3 / U.S. 13.6

2023: Utah 8.0 / U.S. 13.1



STDs and STIs



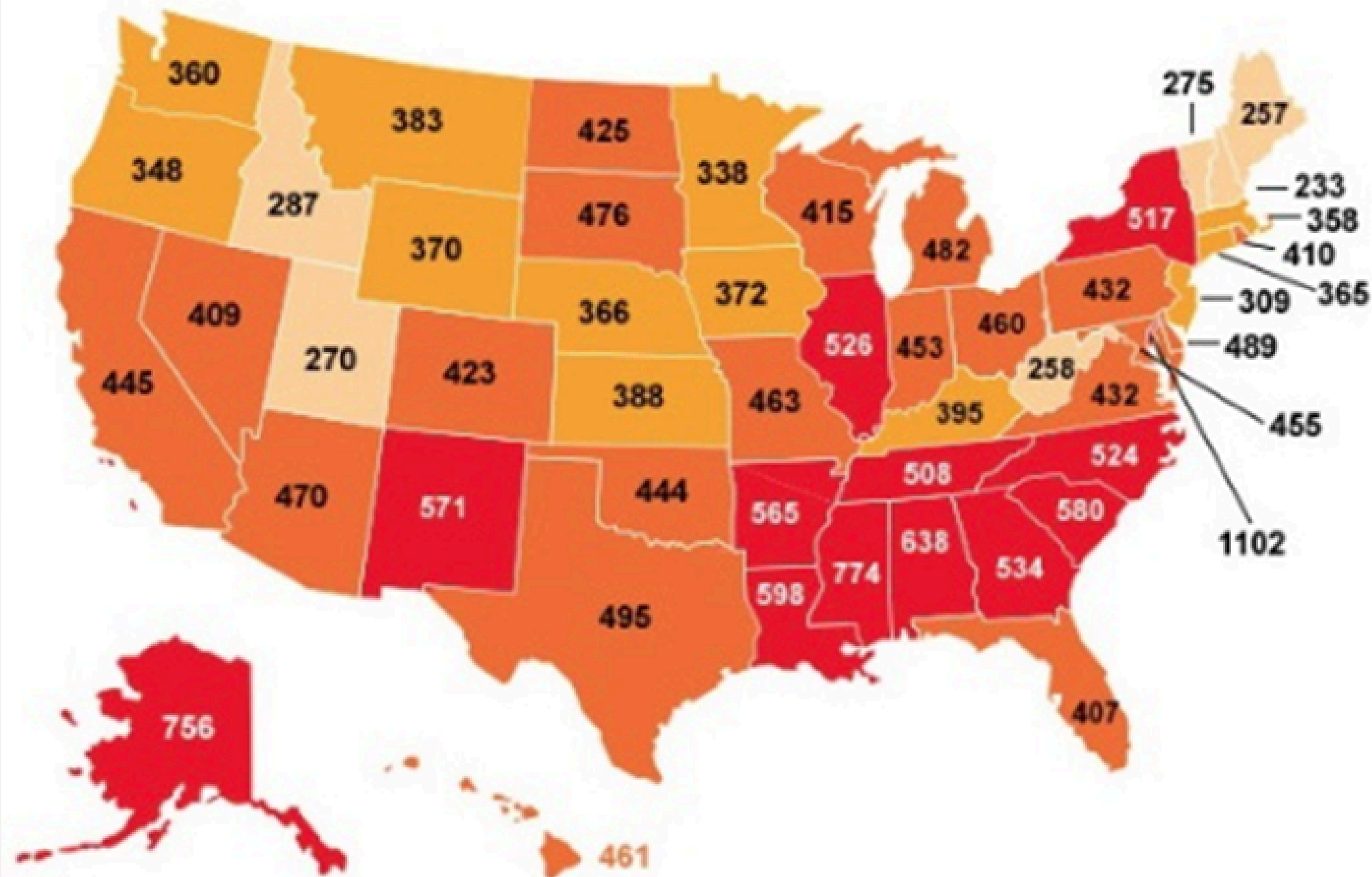
E.g., Chlamydia is an STI. If left untreated it can progress in an STD called pelvic inflammatory disease.

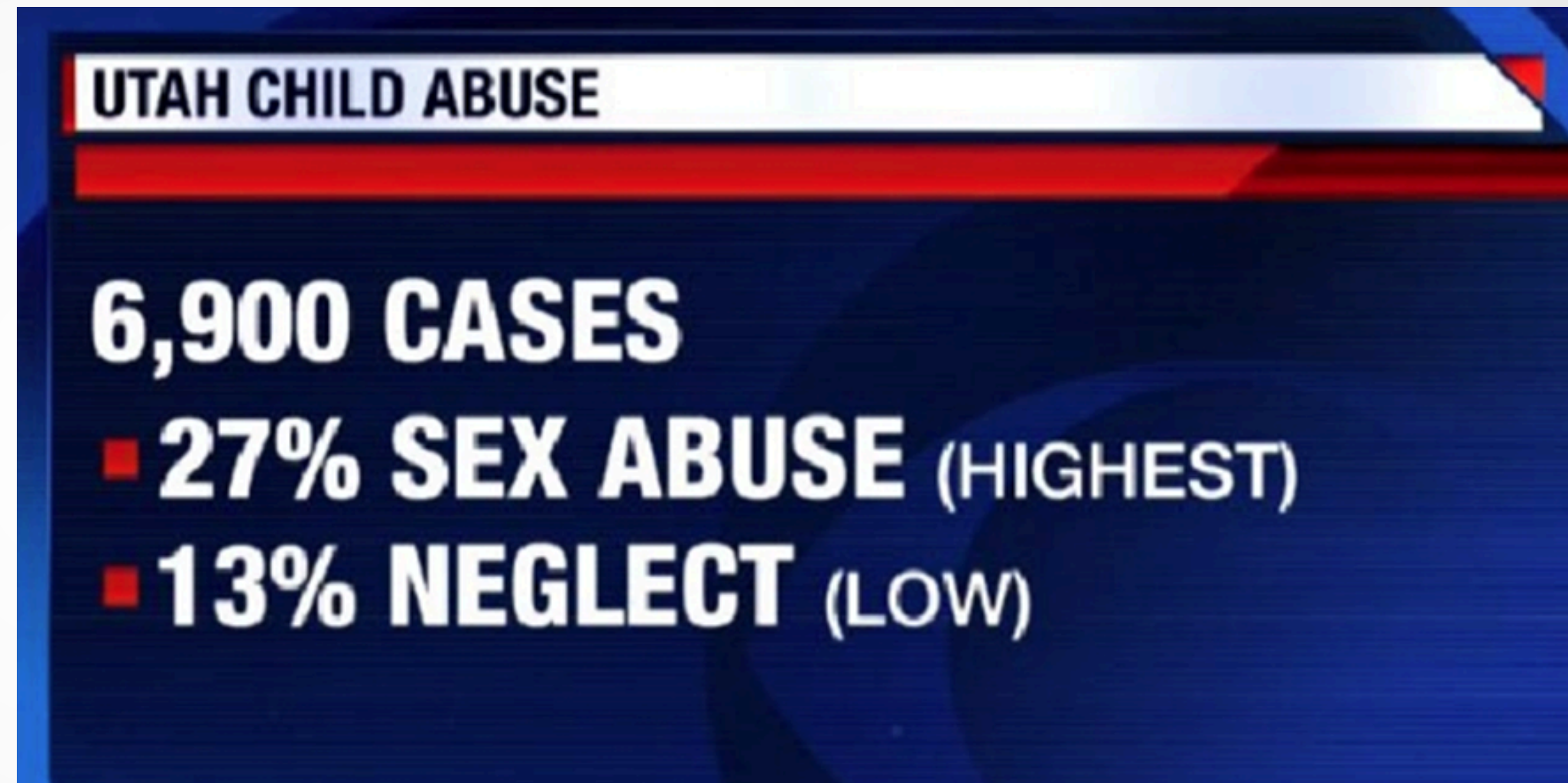
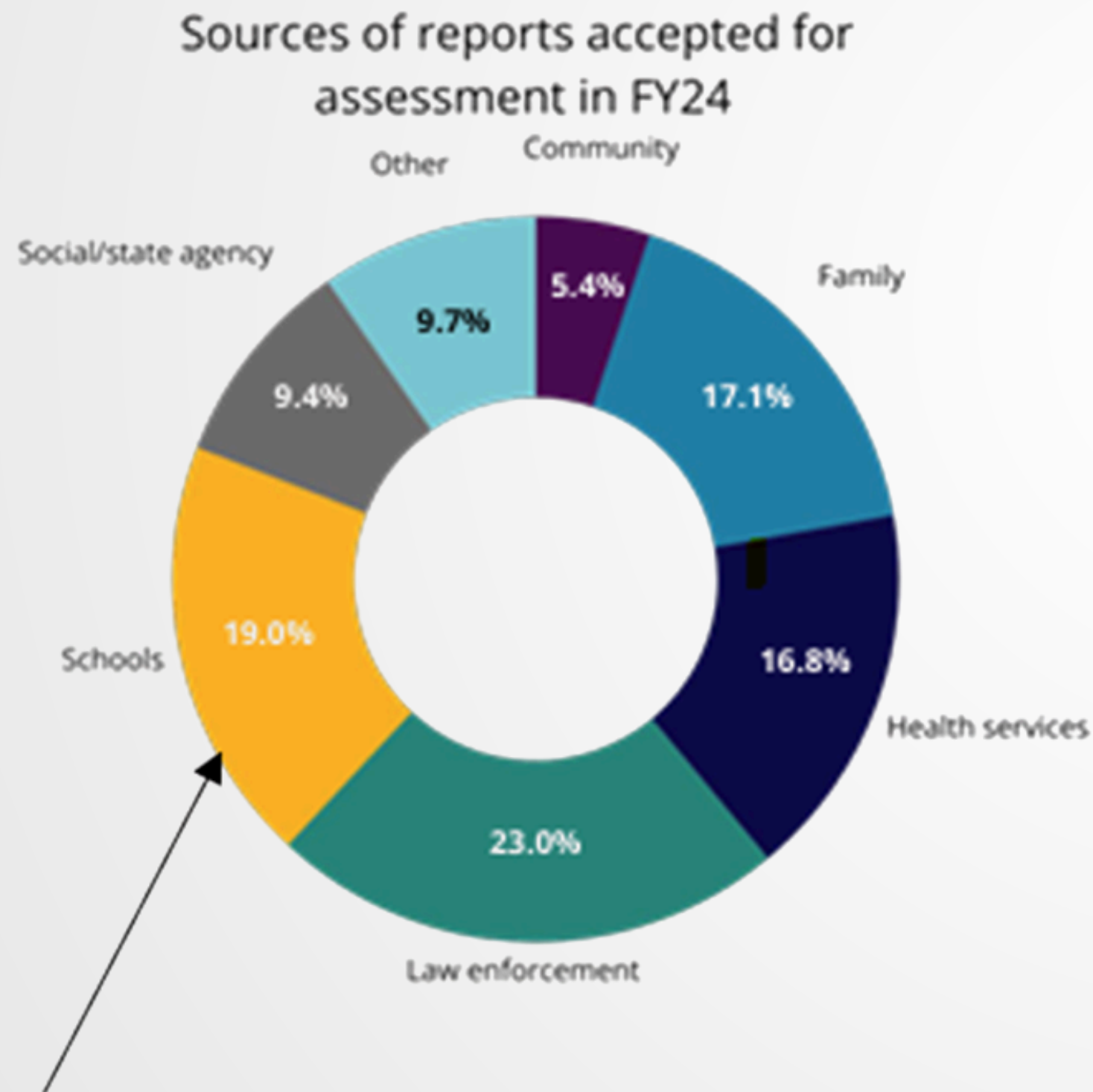
It is worth reiterating that because most often children delay disclosing sexual abuse until adulthood—and that is if they disclose at all—data likely do not represent the full reality of the incidence and prevalence of child sexual abuse. One source stated that an estimated 60.0% to 70.0% of adults do not disclose their abuse as children. Rape is the only violent crime in Utah that is higher than the national average.

- Children are most vulnerable to CSA between the ages of 7 and 13.
- The average age for disclosing CSAA is 52 years. (Sprober et al., 2014).

According to a 2003 National Institute of Justice report, 3 out of 4 adolescents who have been sexually assaulted were victimized by someone they knew well.

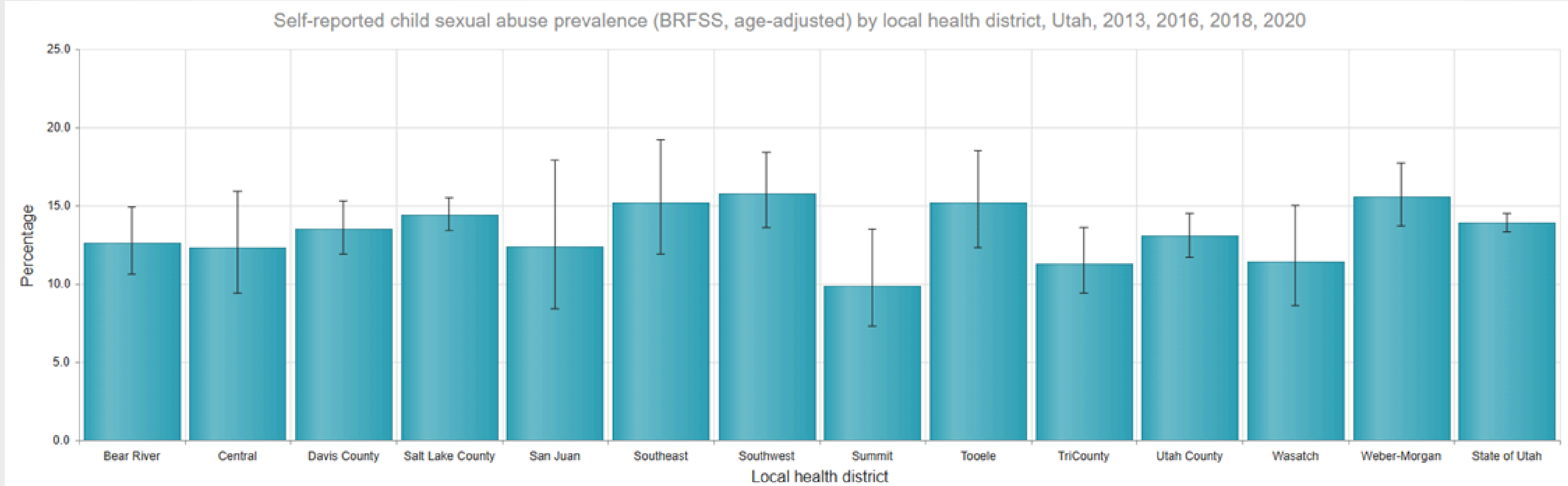
At a conference about preventing child abuse, it was reported that Utah ranks eighth in child abuse and first in sex abuse rates of children nationwide.

Child Sex Abuse Cases – Cont.

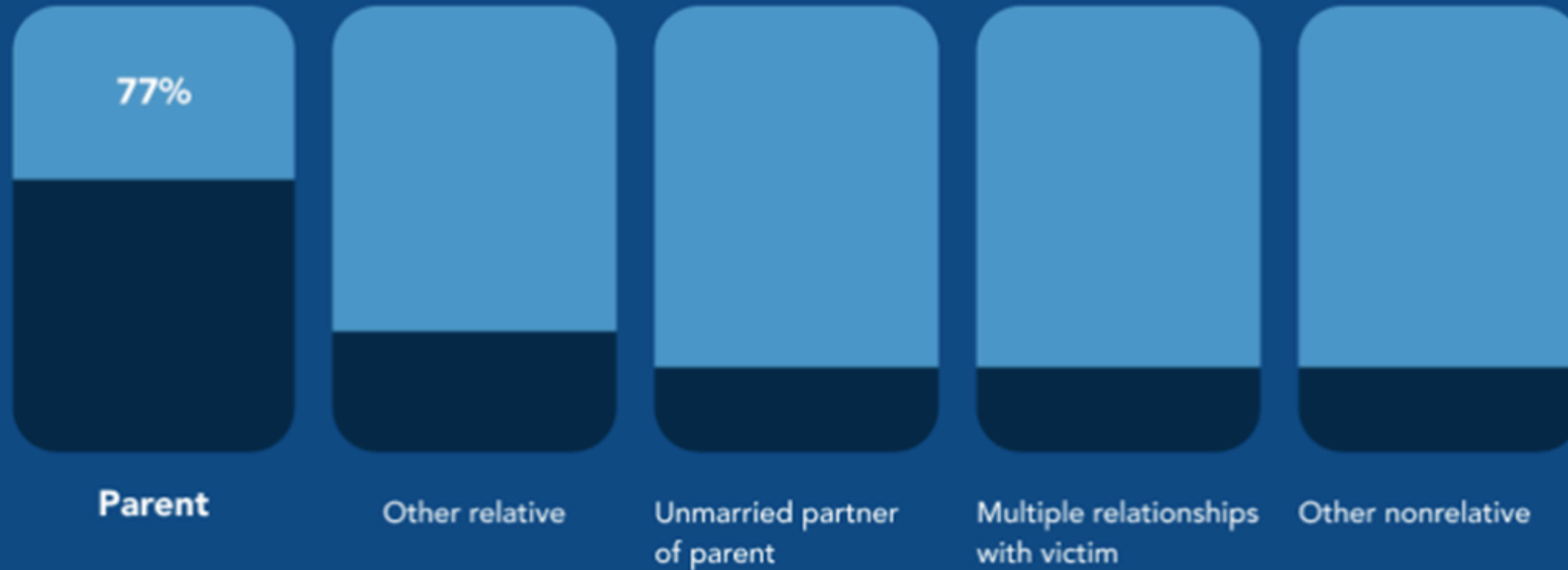


BIPOC children are among the most vulnerable.

American Indian or Alaska Native children have the highest rate of victimization at 14.3 per 1,000 children in the population of the same race or ethnicity, while African American children have the second-highest rate at 12.1 per 1,000 children of the same race or ethnicity.

Child Sex Abuse Cases – Cont.

The majority of offenders are a parent to the victim.
