Greetings Governing Board Members:

Here is my weekly update to try to keep you informed of district happenings...

<u>Teacher Merit Awards</u>: Through the generosity of Mingus Connection, three teachers annually receive merit awards from the Northern AZ Fund. This year, the committee (process and selection criteria are outlined by donors) could not narrow it to three, so four teachers were recognized for exceptional work this year. Each also receives \$1,000 from the foundation. Congratulations to Mike Boysen, Craig Mai, Jason Teague, and Mike Westcott!

<u>Scholarships</u>: The current total for scholarships being awarded to the MUHS class of 2014 is nearly \$2.2 million! Last year's total was about \$1.8 million, so we continue to reach higher levels through the great merits of our students.

School Funding – Higher Ed: A new report released by the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities shows Arizona had the nation's steepest per-student cuts in state aid to higher education and the highest rates of tuition increases from 2008 to 2014. State support for higher education in AZ fell 48.3% and tuition rose 80.6%. Both numbers were adjusted for inflation and both were tops among states. These cuts parallel the cuts we've experienced with state funding for K-12 education. However, K-12 lacks the ability to adjust "tuition" rates or recover funding from other sources other than budget overrides.

<u>Capital Needs</u>: Kirk and I presented an **overview of capital overrides** and solicited staff input into **prioritization of identified capital needs**. We will also be meeting with the **Site Council** next week, with intent to bring the findings to the **Board** on **May 27**th.

<u>Land</u>: I have received **ten-year trend data** on **local real estate transactions** and although most indicators are improving, including the volume of transactions for vacant land, the **median sale price for vacant land continues to decrease** (current median of **\$22,500** – compared with about **\$156,000** in 2006 and 2007). This data supports the advice we have received thus far indicating that it is not a good time to sell land.

<u>Verde Valley Regional Chamber Annual Meeting</u>: The annual <u>Verde Valley Regional Chamber</u> of Commerce meeting is being held on <u>June 24th</u> at 6 PM at the <u>Blazin' M Ranch</u>. This <u>coincides</u> with the <u>June Board meeting</u>. As some of you may usually attend this event (I also went last year), I wanted to bring that to your attention in case you want to <u>move the June meeting</u> to a different date. We can discuss this at the May meeting.

<u>School Facilities Board</u>: The <u>School Facilities Board approved funding</u> for our <u>ball field</u> drainage project (up to \$28,000). We will move forward with getting the project scheduled for this summer. We are still trying to get funding for <u>HVAC units</u> and <u>tennis court resurfacing</u>.

<u>Yavapai Library Network Grant</u>: We have received a grant to cover start up and migration expenses to join the Yavapai Library Network. This will greatly enhance our collection through access to this large network of collections. **Kudos** to **Jennifer Chilton** for pursuing this!

<u>Better Business Bureau Award</u>: One of our students, **Phoebe Chilton**, won the **BBB of Greater AZ Laws of Life Essay Contest (first place** in the **9**th **grade category**). She was recognized earlier this week.
