Recommend approval of a RESOLUTION to honor Senator Joan Huffman, Texas District 17, for meritorious service in support of Wharton County Junior College students, staff, and the communities it serves.

Background and Rationale:

Senator Joan Huffman was first elected to the Texas Senate in 2008 and has been re-elected six times. In this time she has served Texas Senate District 17, which initially contained our Richmond and Sugar Land campuses, and now after the recent redistricting, contains our Wharton and Bay City campuses. During the recently completed 89th Legislative Session Senator Huffman was instrumental in supporting a special request posed by President Betty McCrohan for a \$5 million earmark to the state budget for the expansion of the trade school in Bay City. (The Wharton County Junior College Trade School at Bay City was initiated in 2023 after a \$2 million appropriation was received by W.C.J.C. from the 88th Legislature at the request of President McCrohan.) This supplemental request of \$5 million from the 89th Legislature will expand the course offerings of the Trade School, further building out the facility and instituting new programming and necessary equipment.
