Field Trip Proposal

Trip Purpose

I would like to take two of my yearbook staff members to a two-day yearbook camp sponsored by Lifetouch, our publisher. During this camp we will get a great head start on the 2013 yearbook, and will attend workshops on photography, Photoshop and InDesign, theme development, and the like. It will be a valuable learning experience and will motivate my yearbook staff to create a great book.

Destination and Itinerary

The camp will be held at East Ridge High School in Woodbury, from 8:30 a.m. on August 6 to 4:30 p.m. on August 7. Please see the enclosed PDF flier from Lifetouch for the specific workshops we will attend. Since the trip takes place in the summer, no school days will be missed.

Transportation

I met with Ken Abraham on July 23 and took a road test to become certified to drive an ISD 726 vehicle to and from the camp. All transportation would be in an ISD 726 vehicle.

Housing and Chaperones

Accommodation will be two hotel rooms in Woodbury for the night of August 6: one for Amber Berdie, the only chaperone, and one for two female students to share. The rooms will be paid for by Lifetouch. I have not yet received a confirmation on which hotel in Woodbury; I expect this in the near future from our Lifetouch contact, Carson Amiot, who is making the reservation for us.

Probable number of students

I got the final details of the camp on July 2, 2012 from our Lifetouch representative, and conducted an informal inquiry with my 8 yearbook staffers to see how many would be interested in going. Two said that yes, they would like to go: Katelyn Tasto, a senior who will be one of the co-editors-in-chief, and Brandi Scherping, a senior photographer.

Cost and Fundraising

There is no registration fee for the camp. Lifetouch is paying for our hotel accommodations. The cost to the students will be minimal: they will pay for their own dinner on August 6, and breakfast on August 7, along with any snacks they need during the two days. No fundraising will be necessary.

General Rules

Any student not complying with the guidelines set below should expect disciplinary action. Discipline may range from a simple reprimand, to being sent home by coach bus at the expense of parents/guardians.

- 1. All Minnesota State High School League and Becker High School Handbook Rules and Expectations apply on this trip. The police department, as well as Becker High School, will handle any student involvement in alcohol, drugs, or tobacco. Any involvement in these substances will result in the student being sent home. Parents will pay for the cost of the bus ride for the student.
- 2. Act in a manner that will leave every person in which we have contact with a good impression. We are representing our school and community on this trip.
- 3. All students will attend every workshop on the Lifetouch itinerary.
- 4. Students must let the chaperone know where they are at all times, and when they will return. (For example, if they have to step out of a workshop for a moment, or have to go to the hotel desk for something.)

Vehicle conduct

- 5. Please keep the ISD 726 vehicle clean and neat.
- 6. Please keep the noise level low while the vehicle is in motion.
- 7. Seat belts must be worn whenever the vehicle is running.

Hotel conduct

- 8. No one will leave their room after curfew. After curfew, only open the door for the chaperone and hotel officials.
- 9. At no time is anyone outside the Becker Yearbook Staff allowed to enter your hotel room. Do not give out your hotel name and room number to anyone.
- 10. Obey all rules of the hotel.
- 11. Be respectful of the other guests. You will be held responsible if the manager calls Ms. Berdie because of a disturbance.
- 12. Do not take towels or souvenirs from your room. You will be charged for these items and any damage to the room.
- 13. Keep your door locked at all times.
- 14. Students are not allowed to stay in a chaperone's room or a room other than their assigned room.



Previously, she served as executive director of the Oklahoma Interscholastic Press Association at the University of Oklahoma where she also taught courses in typography, design, desktop publishing and photography. Prior to working at OU, she taught journalism courses and advised student publications at Charles Page High School in Sand Springs, OK, for 22 years.

Schaub is a CSPA Gold Key recipient, past Oklahoma Journalism Teacher of the Year and former Dow Jones Newspaper Fund Distinguished Adviser. She was inducted into the National Scholastic Journalism Hall of Fame in 1991 and served as president of the CSPAA for two terms.

She co-authored and edited Scholastic Yearbook Fundamentals, a monograph published by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association. She served as images editor and contributing writer for CSPA's Magazine Fundamentals.

Schaub chaired the CSPA Judging Standards and Practices Committee for over ten years. In March 2001, she received the Col. Joseph M. Murphy Award from CSPA and The New York Times for outstanding service to scholastic journalism. In 2002, she received the James F. Paschal Award for service as a state scholastic press association director. She also recently was named one of 75 Legends in Texas Scholastic Journalism. At the spring 2004 CSPA convention, she received the Charles R. O'Malley Award for Excellence in Teaching Journalism. She is a professor emerita at OU.
